HB 1669-S2 by House Committee on Financial Institutions & Insurance (originally sponsored by Representatives Hunt, Hasegawa, Appleton, Miloscia, Warnick, Kirby, Williams, and Örmsby)

Addressing the deposit of public funds. (DIGEST OF PROPOSED 2ND SUBSTITUTE)

Allows the deposit of public funds into credit unions.

Requires a credit union approved as a public depositary by the public deposit protection commission to at all times pledge and segregate eligible securities in an amount equal to one hundred percent of all public funds on deposit in the public depositary.

Prohibits a credit union approved as a public depositary by the public deposit protection commission from accepting funds in excess of certain deposit insurance limits.

Defines "emergency zone" with regard to approaching certain emergency or roadside assistance vehicles.

Requires the state patrol and the department of transportation to conduct education and outreach efforts regarding emergency zones, including drivers' obligations and penalties.

Creates the crime of reckless endangerment of emergency workers.

Directing the department of ecology to adopt rules requiring entities to report the emissions of greenhouse gases.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires the department of ecology to modify its greenhouse gas emissions reporting rules and to ensure the rules are consistent with the federal reporting regulations.

Requires reporting of greenhouse gas emissions to the department of ecology by: (1) Persons who emit ten thousand metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent annually from a single facility, source, or site, or from sales of certain fossil fuels;

- (2) Persons required to file tax reports of motor vehicle fuel sales:
- (3) Persons required to report periodic tax reports for special fuel sales; and
 - (4) Distributors of aircraft fuel.

Eliminates the hydraulics appeals board and the forest practices appeals board by transferring their duties to the pollution control hearings board.

Eliminates certain preliminary informal appeals heard internally by agencies.

Transfers the powers, duties, and functions of the growth management hearings boards to the environmental and land use hearings office.

Changing the state student financial aid program.

Modifies disbursal of funds for student financial assistance.

Allows notations on driver abstracts that a person was not at fault in a motor vehicle accident, if the person requests the notation and furnishes copies of court records or documents showing that he or she was not at fault.

Requires the department of fish and wildlife, if notified of a population of deleterious feral animals, to develop and initiate the implementation of a management plan designed to eliminate or minimize the damage caused by the animals.

Expedites all disputes related to treatment so all treatment and diagnostic disputes between a worker, network sponsor, and provider are reviewed initially through the network's internal dispute resolution process.

Concerning hospital safety net assessment.

Creates the hospital safety net assessment and hospital safety net assessment fund to allow the state to generate additional federal financial participation for the medicaid program and provide for increased reimbursement to hospitals.

Imposes a hospital safety net assessment, the funds of which are to be used solely to augment all other funding sources and not as a substitute for any other funds.

Intends: (1) That the total amount assessed not exceed the amount needed, in combination with all other available funds, to support the reimbursement rates and other payments authorized by the act; and

(2) To condition the assessment on receiving federal approval for receipt of additional federal financial

participation and on continuation of other funding sufficient to maintain hospital reimbursement rates and small rural disproportionate share payments at least at the levels in effect on June 30, 2009.

HB 2960 by Representatives Probst, Sullivan, Ormsby, Seaquist, Hunter, and Santos

Establishing a portal for public access to the prototypical school funding model.

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to implement and maintain an internet-based portal that provides ready public access to the state's prototypical school funding model for basic education.

HB 2961 by Representatives Campbell, Hurst, Morrell, Kelley, and Ormsby

Establishing a statewide electronic tracking system for the nonprescription sales of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine.

Regulates the nonprescription sales of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, and phenylpropanolamine.

Requires the attorney general to implement a real-time electronic sales tracking system to monitor the nonprescription sale of products in this state containing any detectable quantity of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine,

phenylpropanolamine, or their salts, isomers, or salts of isomers, provided that the system is available to the state without cost to the state or retailers for accessing the system.

Allowing county treasurers to use electronic bill presentment and payment that includes an automatic electronic payment option for property taxes.

Requires the department of revenue to administer a grant program for counties to assist in the development and implementation of an electronic bill presentment and payment system.

Concerning oil spill contingency plan requirements.

Requires each vessel and each onshore and offshore facility to activate their contingency plan in the event of an oil spill.

Adjusting the oil spill response tax and oil spill administration tax.

Funds the state's oil spill, prevention, preparedness, response, and environmental restoration activities.

Establishing a state meat inspection program.

Establishes a state meat inspection program to encourage economic investment in the state's livestock industry and promote economic development within our communities.

Creates the meat inspection account.

HB 2967 by Representatives White and Kenney

Mitigating the impacts of the state route number 520 corridor project on the Washington park arboretum.

Creates a program to support the preservation, maintenance, and enhancement of the grounds and collections at the Washington park arboretum in order to partially offset the impacts from the current configuration of state route number 520 and its associated ramps, as well as the impacts from proposed changes to the state route number 520 corridor.

Creates the Washington park arboretum support

Requires the department of transportation to deposit one percent of any revenue from the toll imposed on the state route number 520 corridor into the account.

HB 2968 by Representative Hudgins

Regarding the loss of an electronic device.

Regulates the sale of certain personal electronic devices.

HB 2969 by Representative Hudgins

Promoting efficiencies in the services provided by the office of the public printer.

Requires the public printer to: (1) Provide a program of managed print services to state agencies that are required to use these services and to other agencies that choose to use these services; and

(2) Consult with the office of financial management and state agencies to more efficiently manage the use of envelopes.

Requires certain state agencies to: (1) Use managed print services provided through the public printer unless exempted by the director of financial management; and

(2) Consult with the public printer to more efficiently and cost-effectively use envelopes by standardizing the types of envelopes to the extent consistent with the agency's business needs.

Prohibits the state printing plant from adding additional charges to any work or supplies secured from private sources on behalf of the state.

HB 2970 by Representatives Hunter and Conway; by request of Department of Revenue

Addressing tax avoidance.

Closes use tax and real estate excise tax loopholes and provides the department of revenue with enhanced tools to invalidate abusive tax avoidance transactions.
