No later 20 than December 31, 2011, the judicial information systems committee 21 shall provide a report to the legislature on the status of data 22 exchange, and the procurement process for a SCOMIS replacement and a 23 case management system that is designed to meet the requirements 24 approved by the superior courts and the county clerks or all thirty-25 nine counties. The legislature shall solicit input on both reports 26 from various judicial, legislative, and executive stakeholders."

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## EFFECT:

- Removes \$6 million from the Judicial Information System Account for the Information Services Division of the Administrative Office of the Courts and replaces it with \$6 million General Fund-State.
- Adds \$4.9 million from the Judicial Information Systems Account for development and implementation of a Superior Court case management system.
- Deletes language prohibiting funds from being expended for a Superior Court case management system.
- Requires the Judicial Information Systems Committee to report to the legislature on the recommendations of a Superior Court case management system feasibility study and on the procurement process for a system that is designed to meet the requirements of all the Superior Courts and County Clerks.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

Increases General Fund-State by \$6,011,000. Reduces Other Funds by \$1,038,000.

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
