EFFECT:

- (1) Modifies the statement of Legislative intent; the Legislature will provide extended foster care services pursuant to the federal Fostering Connections Act to youth until they reach age 19 instead of until age 21.
- (2) Modifies the definition of a child or youth to include individuals who are age 18 and who elect to receive extended foster care services, rather than including individuals ages 18 to 21.
- (3) Modifies the authority of the Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) to provide extended foster care services; the DSHS has the authority to provide such services to youth until they reach 19, rather than age 21.
- (4) Modifies the authority of the DSHS provide adoption support benefits or subsidies; DSHS may provide such support on behalf of youth until the youth reaches age 19, rather than age 21.
- (5) Modifies the authority of the DSHS to provide independent living services to youth; such services may be provided for youth until age 19, rather than age 21.
- (6) Modifies the authority of the DSHS to provide continued foster care for youth in the state-funded Foster Care to 21 program; the DSHS has authority to provide continued care to a youth until age 19, rather than age 21, if the youth is participating in a postsecondary or vocational educational program, a program designed to remove barriers, is employed for 80 hours per month or medically unable to participate in such activity.
