- 1 On page 1, beginning on line 4, strike all of section 1 and insert
- 2 the following:
- 3 "Sec. 1. RCW 28A.300.380 and 2011 1st sp.s. c 27 s 4 are each
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (1) The legislature finds that career and technical student
- 6 organizations help to prepare students to meet minimum college and
- 7 workforce requirements.
- 8 (2) Career and technical student organization activities are
- 9 integral to career and technical education if they:
- 10 (a) Provide instructional strategies used to develop, improve, and
- 11 expand occupational competencies that relate to a particular career
- 12 and technical subject matter;
- 13 (b) Are an extension of the classroom and laboratory instructional
- 14 program that enriches and enhances classroom learning; and
- 15 (c) Include curriculum-oriented activities to help students to
- 16 gain personal and leadership skills that maximize employability and
- 17 the ability to become productive citizens in the workforce, home, and
- 18 community.
- 19 (3) In order to receive state support, career and technical
- 20 student organizations must:
- 21 (a) Prepare students for career experiences beyond high school;
- 22 (b) Help students develop personal, leadership, technical, and
- 23 occupational skills;
- 24 (c) Be an integral component of career and technical education
- 25 instructional programs; and
- 26 (d) Directly help students achieve state learning goals,
- 27 especially goals three and four with respect to critical thinking,

- 1 problem solving, and decision-making skills. To the extent funds are
- 2 available, the superintendent of public instruction shall maintain
- 3 support for statewide coordination for career and technical student
- 4 organizations by providing program staff support that is available to
- 5 assist in meeting the needs of career and technical student
- 6 organizations and their members and students. The superintendent may
- 7 provide additional support to the organizations through contracting
- 8 with independent coordinators.
- 9  $((\frac{(2)}{(2)}))(4)$  Career and technical student organizations eligible for
- 10 technical assistance and other support services under this section are
- 11 organizations recognized as career and technical student organizations
- 12 by:
- 13 (a) The United States department of education; or
- 14 (b) The superintendent of public instruction, if such recognition
- 15 is recommended by the Washington association for career and technical
- 16 education.
- $((\frac{3}{(3)}))(5)$  Career and technical student organizations eligible for
- 18 technical assistance and other support services under this section
- 19 include, but are not limited to: The national FFA organization;
- 20 family, career, and community leaders of America; skillsUSA;
- 21 distributive education clubs of America; future business leaders of
- 22 America; and the technology student association."

EFFECT: Makes a technical amendment by adding the same language as the original bill to a section of law that was amended in the 2011 legislative session.

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
