## <u>SHB 2190</u> - H AMD 1256 By Representative Rivers

On page 9, after line 27, insert the following: 1 2 "(5) The Columbia River Crossing bridge project is a major 3 initiative to address congestion problems on I-5 between Portland, Oregon and Vancouver, Washington that requires support by not only the 4 Governors of both states but the Legislatures as well. The joint 5 transportation committee must convene a subcommittee for legislative 6 7 oversight of the I-5/Columbia River Crossing bridge replacement 8 project. The Columbia River Crossing legislative oversight 9 subcommittee will be made up of six members, two appointed by the 10 chair and ranking member of the Senate transportation committee, two 11 appointed by the chair and ranking member of the House transportation 12 committee, one designee of the Governor, and one citizen jointly 13 appointed by the four members of the joint transportation executive 14 committee. The citizen appointee must be a Washington state resident 15 of the area served by the bridge. At least two of the legislative 16 members must be from the legislative districts served by the bridge. 17 In addition to reviewing project and financing information, the subcommittee must also coordinate with the Oregon legislative 18 19 oversight committee for the Columbia River Crossing bridge." 20 21 On page 52, after line 3, insert the following: 22 "(d) The Washington state department of transportation budget 23 includes resources to continue work on solutions that advance the 24 Columbia River Crossing project to completion of the required 25 environmental impact statement. The department must report to the 26 Columbia River Crossing legislative oversight subcommittee of the 27 joint transportation committee, established in section 204(5) of this

1 act, on the progress made on the Columbia River Crossing project at 2 each meeting of the oversight committee. Reporting must include 3 updated information on cost estimates, right-of-way purchases and 4 procurement schedules, and financing plans for the Columbia River 5 crossing project, including projected traffic volumes, fuel and gas 6 price assumptions, toll rates, costs of toll collections, as well as 7 potential need for general transportation funding. By January 1, 8 2013, the department shall provide to the oversight subcommittee of 9 the joint transportation committee a phased master plan for the 10 Columbia River crossing project."

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EFFECT: Directs the Joint Transportation Committee to convene a Columbia River Crossing (CRC) Oversight subcommittee. The subcommittee will have four legislative members, a designee of the Governor, and a citizen appointee. The citizen appointee and two of the legislative appointees must be residents of the area served by the bridge. Directs the Department of Transportation to report on the progress of the CRC project at each meeting of the Oversight subcommittee. Reporting is required on cost estimates, right of way purchases, financing plans, projected traffic volumes, assumed toll rates, and other information. Requires DOT to provide a phased master plan for the CRC project.

FISCAL IMPACT: No net change to appropriated levels.

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
