       (1)(a) The commission shall grant to any person who meets the
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26 eligibility requirements specified in this section a senior citizen's

27 pass which shall: (i) Entitle such a person, and members of his or

- 1 her camping unit, to a fifty percent reduction in the campsite rental
- 2 fee prescribed by the commission; and (ii) entitle such a person to
- 3 free admission to any state park.
- 4 (b) The commission shall grant a senior citizen's pass to any
- 5 person who applies for the senior citizen's pass and who meets the
- 6 following requirements:
- 7 (i) The person is at least sixty-two years of age;
- 8 (ii) The person is a domiciliary of the state of Washington and
- 9 meets reasonable residency requirements prescribed by the commission;
- 10 and
- 11 (iii) The person and his or her spouse have a combined income that
- 12 would qualify the person for a property tax exemption pursuant to RCW
- 13 84.36.381. The financial eligibility requirements of this subsection
- 14 (1)(b)(iii) apply regardless of whether the applicant for a senior
- 15 citizen's pass owns taxable property or has obtained or applied for
- 16 such property tax exemption.
- 17 (c) Each senior citizen's pass granted pursuant to this section is
- 18 valid as long as the senior citizen meets the requirements of (b)(ii)
- 19 of this subsection. A senior citizen meeting the eligibility
- 20 requirements of this section may make a voluntary donation for the
- 21 upkeep and maintenance of state parks.
- 22 (d) A holder of a senior citizen's pass shall surrender the pass
- 23 upon request of a commission employee when the employee has reason to
- 24 believe the holder fails to meet the criteria in (b) of this
- 25 subsection. The holder shall have the pass returned upon providing
- 26 proof to the satisfaction of the director that the holder meets the
- 27 eligibility criteria for obtaining the senior citizen's pass.
- 28 (2)(a) Any resident of Washington who is disabled as defined by
- 29 the social security administration and who receives social security
- 30 benefits for that disability, or any other benefits for that
- 31 disability from any other governmental or nongovernmental source, or
- 32 who is entitled to benefits for permanent disability under *RCW
- 33 71A.10.020(3) due to unemployability full time at the minimum wage, or
- 34 who is legally blind or profoundly deaf, or who has been issued a

- 1 card, decal, or special license plate for a permanent disability under 2 RCW 46.19.010 shall be entitled to receive, regardless of age and upon
- 3 making application therefor, a disability pass at no cost to the
- 4 holder. The pass shall: (i) Entitle such a person, and members of
- 5 his or her camping unit, to a fifty percent reduction in the campsite
- 6 rental fee prescribed by the commission; and (ii) entitle such a
- 7 person to free admission to any state park.
- 8 (b) A card, decal, or special license plate issued for a permanent
- 9 disability under RCW 46.19.010 may serve as a pass for the holder to
- 10 entitle that person and members of the person's camping unit to a
- 11 fifty percent reduction in the campsite rental fee prescribed by the
- 12 commission, and to allow the holder free admission to state parks.
- 13 (3) Any resident of Washington who is a veteran and has a service-
- 14 connected disability of at least thirty percent shall be entitled to
- 15 receive a lifetime veteran's disability pass at no cost to the holder.
- 16 The pass shall: (a) Entitle such a person, and members of his or her
- 17 camping unit, to free use of any campsite within any state park; (b)
- 18 entitle such a person to free admission to any state park; ((and)) (c)
- 19 entitle such a person to an exemption from any reservation fees; and
- 20 (d) entitle such a person to a complimentary discover pass consistent
- 21 with the provisions of RCW 79A.80.020.
- 22 (4)(a) Any Washington state resident who provides out-of-home care
- 23 to a child, as either a licensed foster-family home or a person
- 24 related to the child, is entitled to a foster home pass.
- 25 (b) An applicant for a foster home pass must request a pass in the
- 26 manner required by the commission. Upon receipt of a properly
- 27 submitted request, the commission shall verify with the department of
- 28 social and health services that the applicant qualifies under (a) of
- 29 this subsection. Once issued, a foster home pass is valid for the
- 30 period, which may not be less than one year, designated by the
- 31 commission.
- 32 (c) When accompanied by a child receiving out-of-home care from
- 33 the pass holder, a foster home pass: (i) Entitles such a person, and
- 34 members of his or her camping unit, to free use of any campsite within

- 1 any state park; and (ii) entitles such a person to free admission to 2 any state park.
- 3 (d) For the purposes of this subsection (4):
- 4 (i) "Out-of-home care" means placement in a foster-family home or
- 5 with a person related to the child under the authority of chapter
- 6 13.32A, 13.34, or 74.13 RCW;
- 7 (ii) "Foster-family home" has the same meaning as defined in RCW
- 8 74.15.020; and
- 9 (iii) "Person related to the child" means those persons referred
- 10 to in RCW 74.15.020(2)(a) (i) through (vi).
- 11 (5) All passes issued pursuant to this section are valid at all
- 12 parks any time during the year. However, the pass is not valid for
- 13 admission to concessionaire operated facilities.
- 14 (6) The commission shall negotiate payment and costs, to allow
- 15 holders of a foster home pass free access and usage of park campsites,
- 16 with the following nonoperated, nonstate-owned parks: Central Ferry,
- 17 Chief Timothy, Crow Butte, and Lyons Ferry. The commission shall seek
- 18 state general fund reimbursement on a biennial basis.
- 19 (7) The commission may deny or revoke any Washington state park
- 20 pass issued under this section for cause, including but not limited to
- 21 the following:
- 22 (a) Residency outside the state of Washington;
- 23 (b) Violation of laws or state park rules resulting in eviction
- 24 from a state park;
- 25 (c) Intimidating, obstructing, or assaulting a park employee or
- 26 park volunteer who is engaged in the performance of official duties;
- 27 (d) Fraudulent use of a pass;
- 28 (e) Providing false information or documentation in the
- 29 application for a state parks pass;
- 30 (f) Refusing to display or show the pass to park employees when
- 31 requested; or
- 32 (g) Failing to provide current eligibility information upon
- 33 request by the agency or when eligibility ceases or changes.

- 1 (8) This section shall not affect or otherwise impair the power of 2 the commission to continue or discontinue any other programs it has 3 adopted for senior citizens.
- 4 (9) The commission may engage in a mutually agreed upon reciprocal 5 or discounted program for all or specific pass programs with other 6 outdoor recreation agencies.
- 7 (10) The commission shall adopt those rules as it finds 8 appropriate for the administration of this section. Among other 9 things, the rules shall prescribe a definition of "camping unit" which 10 will authorize a reasonable number of persons traveling with the 11 person having a pass to stay at the campsite rented by such a person, 12 a minimum Washington residency requirement for applicants for a senior 13 citizen's pass, and an application form to be completed by applicants 14 for a senior citizen's pass."

EFFECT: Provides a complimentary Discover Pass to any person who qualifies for a lifetime veteran's disability pass from the State Parks and Recreation Commission.

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
