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- 3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** RCW 28B.15.067 and 2011 1st sp.s. c 10 s 3 4 are each amended to read as follows:
- 5 (1) Tuition fees shall be established under the provisions of this 6 chapter.
- 7 (2) Beginning in the 2011-12 academic year, reductions or 8 increases in full-time tuition fees shall be as provided in the 9 omnibus appropriations act for resident undergraduate students at
- 10 community and technical colleges. The governing boards of the state
- 11 universities, regional universities, and The Evergreen State College;
- 12 and the state board for community and technical colleges may reduce or
- 13 increase full-time tuition fees for all students other than resident
- 14 undergraduates, including nonresident students, summer school
- 15 students, and students in other self-supporting degree programs.
- 16 Percentage increases in full-time tuition may exceed the fiscal growth
- 17 factor. The state board for community and technical colleges may
- 18 pilot or institute differential tuition models. The board may define
- 19 scale, scope, and rationale for the models.
- 20 (3)(a) Beginning with the 2011-12 academic year and through the
- 21 end of the 2014-15 academic year, the governing boards of the state
- 22 universities, the regional universities, and The Evergreen State
- 23 College may reduce or increase full-time tuition fees for all
- 24 students, including summer school students and students in other self-
- 25 supporting degree programs, except that for at least four consecutive
- 26 academic years following initial full-time enrollment, a student shall
- 27 be guaranteed that there will be no increase in the tuition fees paid

- 1 by that student. Percentage increases in full-time tuition fees may
- 2 exceed the fiscal growth factor. Reductions or increases may be made
- 3 for all or portions of an institution's programs, campuses, courses,
- 4 or students.
- 5 (b) Prior to reducing or increasing tuition for each academic
- 6 year, the governing boards of the state universities, the regional
- 7 universities, and The Evergreen State College shall consult with
- 8 existing student associations or organizations with student
- 9 undergraduate and graduate representatives regarding the impacts of
- 10 potential tuition increases. Governing boards shall be required to
- 11 provide data regarding the percentage of students receiving financial
- 12 aid, the sources of aid, and the percentage of total costs of
- 13 attendance paid for by aid.
- 14 (c) Prior to reducing or increasing tuition for each academic
- 15 year, the state board for community and technical college system shall
- 16 consult with existing student associations or organizations with
- 17 undergraduate student representation regarding the impacts of
- 18 potential tuition increases. The state board for community and
- 19 technical colleges shall provide data regarding the percentage of
- 20 students receiving financial aid, the sources of aid, and the
- 21 percentage of total costs of attendance paid for by aid.
- 22 (4) Beginning with the 2015-16 academic year through the 2018-19
- 23 academic year, the governing boards of the state universities,
- 24 regional universities, and The Evergreen State College may set tuition
- 25 for resident undergraduates as follows:
- 26 (a) If state funding for a college or university falls below the
- 27 state funding provided in the operating budget for fiscal year 2011,
- 28 the governing board may increase tuition up to the limits set in (d)
- 29 of this subsection, reduce enrollments, or both;
- 30 (b) If state funding for a college or university is at least at
- 31 the level of state funding provided in the operating budget for fiscal
- 32 year 2011, the governing board may increase tuition up to the limits
- 33 set in (d) of this subsection and shall continue to at least maintain

- 1 the actual enrollment levels for fiscal year 2011 or increase 2 enrollments as required in the omnibus appropriations act; and
- 3 (c) If state funding is increased so that combined with resident 4 undergraduate tuition the sixtieth percentile of the total per-student 5 funding at similar public institutions of higher education in the 6 global challenge states under RCW 28B.15.068 is exceeded, the 7 governing board shall decrease tuition by the amount needed for the 8 total per-student funding to be at the sixtieth percentile under RCW
- 10 (d) The amount of tuition set by the governing board for an 11 institution under this subsection (4) may not exceed the sixtieth 12 percentile of the resident undergraduate tuition of similar public 13 institutions of higher education in the global challenge states((-));
- 14 <u>(e) In subsections (a) through (c) a student shall be guaranteed</u>
 15 that there will be no increase in the tuition fees paid by that
 16 student for at least four consecutive academic years following initial
 17 full-time enrollment.
- 18 (5) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not 19 apply to high school students enrolling in participating institutions 20 of higher education under RCW 28A.600.300 through 28A.600.400.
- 21 (6) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not 22 apply to eligible students enrolling in a dropout reengagement program 23 through an interlocal agreement between a school district and a 24 community or technical college under RCW 28A.175.100 through 25 28A.175.110.
- 26 (7) The tuition fees established under this chapter shall not 27 apply to eligible students enrolling in a community or technical 28 college participating in the pilot program under RCW 28B.50.534 for 29 the purpose of obtaining a high school diploma.
- 30 (8) Beginning in the 2019-20 academic year, reductions or 31 increases in full-time tuition fees for resident undergraduates at 32 four-year institutions of higher education shall be as provided in the 33 omnibus appropriations act."

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EFFECT: Guarantees that tuition fees paid by a student shall remain the same for that student for at least four consecutive years following his or her initial full-time enrollment at a public four-year institution of higher education for the period that public baccalaureate institutions have tuition setting authority.

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
