EFFECT: Removes the ability of the agencies to use revenues in the recreation access pass account to secure public access to public lands; removes the 50 percent discount on the purchase of a Discover Pass when purchased in the same transaction as a hunting or fishing license; retains the existing fish and wildlife lands vehicle use permit that allows for the holder to park on lands managed by the Department of Fish and Wildlife; removes state liquor stores from the list of locations where Discover Passes may be purchased; requires one of the natural resource agencies, and not the Department of Licensing, to actually distribute any Discover Passes for which the Department of Licensing has collected payment; requires the State Parks and Recreation Commission to provide an opportunity for a local government or other unit of state government to assume control of a state park prior to the closing of a park to public access; sets the cost of a Discover Pass at \$30 regardless of where the pass is purchased; and requires any transaction fees paid by the purchaser to be deducted from the sale price of the pass.
