- 1 On page 28, after line 27 of the amendment, insert the following:
- 2 "Sec. 33. RCW 79A.05.030 and 2005 c 373 s 1 and 2005 c 360 § 5
- 3 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- 4 The commission shall:
- 5 (1) Have the care, charge, control, and supervision of all parks 6 and parkways acquired or set aside by the state for park or parkway
- 7 purposes.
- 8 (2) Adopt policies, and adopt, issue, and enforce rules pertaining
- 9 to the use, care, and administration of state parks and parkways. The
- 10 commission shall cause a copy of the rules to be kept posted in a
- 11 conspicuous place in every state park to which they are applicable,
- 12 but failure to post or keep any rule posted shall be no defense to any
- 13 prosecution for the violation thereof.
- 14 (3) Permit the use of state parks and parkways by the public under
- 15 such rules as shall be adopted.
- 16 (4) Clear, drain, grade, seed, and otherwise improve or beautify
- 17 parks and parkways, and erect structures, buildings, fireplaces, and
- 18 comfort stations and build and maintain paths, trails, and roadways
- 19 through or on parks and parkways.
- 20 (5) Grant concessions or leases in state parks and parkways, upon
- 21 such rentals, fees, or percentage of income or profits and for such
- 22 terms, in no event longer than fifty years, and upon such conditions
- 23 as shall be approved by the commission: PROVIDED, That leases
- 24 exceeding a twenty-year term shall require a unanimous vote of the
- 25 commission: PROVIDED FURTHER, That if, during the term of any
- 26 concession or lease, it is the opinion of the commission that it would
- 27 be in the best interest of the state, the commission may, with the

- 1 consent of the concessionaire or lessee, alter and amend the terms and
- 2 conditions of such concession or lease: PROVIDED FURTHER, That
- 3 television station leases shall be subject to the provisions of RCW
- 4 79A.05.085, only: PROVIDED FURTHER, That the rates of such
- 5 concessions or leases shall be renegotiated at five-year intervals.
- 6 No concession shall be granted which will prevent the public from
- 7 having free access to the scenic attractions of any park or parkway.
- 8 (6) Employ such assistance as it deems necessary. Commission
- 9 expenses relating to its use of volunteer assistance shall be limited
- 10 to premiums or assessments for the insurance of volunteers by the
- 11 department of labor and industries, compensation of staff who assist
- 12 volunteers, materials and equipment used in authorized volunteer
- 13 projects, training, reimbursement of volunteer travel as provided in
- 14 RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060, and other reasonable expenses relating to
- 15 volunteer recognition. The commission, at its discretion, may waive
- 16 commission fees otherwise applicable to volunteers. ((The commission
- 17 shall not use volunteers to replace or supplant classified positions.
- 18 The use of volunteers may not lead to the elimination of any employees
- 19 or permanent positions in the bargaining unit.))
- 20 (7) By majority vote of its authorized membership select and
- 21 purchase or obtain options upon, lease, or otherwise acquire for and
- 22 in the name of the state such tracts of land, including shore and tide
- 23 lands, for park and parkway purposes as it deems proper. If the
- 24 commission cannot acquire any tract at a price it deems reasonable, it
- 25 may, by majority vote of its authorized membership, obtain title
- 26 thereto, or any part thereof, by condemnation proceedings conducted by
- 27 the attorney general as provided for the condemnation of rights-of-way
- 28 for state highways. Option agreements executed under authority of
- 29 this subsection shall be valid only if:
- 30 (a) The cost of the option agreement does not exceed one dollar;
- 31 and
- 32 (b) Moneys used for the purchase of the option agreement are from
- 33 (i) funds appropriated therefor, or (ii) funds appropriated for
- 34 undesignated land acquisitions, or (iii) funds deemed by the

- 1 commission to be in excess of the amount necessary for the purposes
- 2 for which they were appropriated; and
- 3 (c) The maximum amount payable for the property upon exercise of
- 4 the option does not exceed the appraised value of the property.
- 5 (8) Cooperate with the United States, or any county or city of
- 6 this state, in any matter pertaining to the acquisition, development,
- 7 redevelopment, renovation, care, control, or supervision of any park
- 8 or parkway, and enter into contracts in writing to that end. All
- 9 parks or parkways, to which the state contributed or in whose care,
- 10 control, or supervision the state participated pursuant to the
- 11 provisions of this section, shall be governed by the provisions
- 12 hereof.
- 13 (9) Within allowable resources, maintain policies that increase
- 14 the number of people who have access to free or low-cost recreational
- 15 opportunities for physical activity, including noncompetitive physical
- 16 activity.
- 17 (10) Adopt rules establishing the requirements for a criminal
- 18 history record information search for the following: Job applicants,
- 19 volunteers, and independent contractors who have unsupervised access
- 20 to children or vulnerable adults, or who will be responsible for
- 21 collecting or disbursing cash or processing credit/debit card
- 22 transactions. These background checks will be done through the
- 23 Washington state patrol criminal identification section and may
- 24 include a national check from the federal bureau of investigation,
- 25 which shall be through the submission of fingerprints. A permanent
- 26 employee of the commission, employed as of July 24, 2005, is exempt
- 27 from the provisions of this subsection."

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- 29 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any
- 30 internal references accordingly.

EFFECT: Removes the restriction on the State Parks and Recreation Commission's use of volunteers (which, under current law, limits the use of volunteers to a level that does not replace or supplant classified positions or lead to the elimination of any employees or permanent positions in a bargaining unit).
