1 On page 2, beginning on line 15, strike all of sections 2 and 3 2 and insert the following:

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- 4 "Sec. 2. RCW 19.28.191 and 2006 c 185 s 7 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) Upon receipt of the application, the department shall review 7 the application and determine whether the applicant is eligible to 8 take an examination for the master journeyman electrician, journeyman 9 electrician, master specialty electrician, or specialty electrician 10 certificate of competency.
- 11 (a) Before July 1, 2005, an applicant who possesses a valid 12 journeyman electrician certificate of competency in effect for the 13 previous four years and a valid general administrator's certificate 14 may apply for a master journeyman electrician certificate of 15 competency without examination.
- 16 (b) Before July 1, 2005, an applicant who possesses a valid 17 specialty electrician certificate of competency, in the specialty 18 applied for, for the previous two years and a valid specialty 19 administrator's certificate, in the specialty applied for, may apply 20 for a master specialty electrician certificate of competency without 21 examination.
- (c) Before December 1, 2003, the following persons may obtain an 23 equipment repair specialty electrician certificate of competency 24 without examination:
- 25 (i) A person who has successfully completed an apprenticeship 26 program approved under chapter 49.04 RCW for the machinist trade; and

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- 1 (ii) A person who provides evidence in a form prescribed by the
- 2 department affirming that: (A) He or she was employed as of April 1,
- 3 2003, by a factory-authorized equipment dealer or service company; and
- 4 (B) he or she has worked in equipment repair for a minimum of four
- 5 thousand hours.
- 6 (d) To be eligible to take the examination for a master journeyman
- 7 electrician certificate of competency the applicant must have
- 8 possessed a valid journeyman electrician certificate of competency for
- 9 four years.
- 10 (e) To be eligible to take the examination for a master specialty
- 11 electrician certificate of competency the applicant must have
- 12 possessed a valid specialty electrician certificate of competency, in
- 13 the specialty applied for, for two years.
- 14 (f) To be eligible to take the examination for a journeyman
- 15 certificate of competency the applicant must have:
- 16 (i) Provided evidence in a form prescribed by the department
- 17 affirming that the applicant has met the in-class education
- 18 requirement of section 1 of this act; and
- 19 (ii)(A) Worked in the electrical construction trade for a minimum
- 20 of eight thousand hours, of which four thousand hours shall be in
- 21 industrial or commercial electrical installation under the supervision
- 22 of a master journeyman electrician or journeyman electrician and not
- 23 more than a total of four thousand hours in all specialties under the
- 24 supervision of a master journeyman electrician, journeyman
- 25 electrician, master specialty electrician working in that
- 26 electrician's specialty, or specialty electrician working in that
- 27 electrician's specialty. Speciality electricians with less than a
- 28 four thousand hour work experience requirement cannot credit the time
- 29 required to obtain that specialty towards qualifying to become a
- 30 journeyman electrician; or
- 31 (((ii)))(B) Successfully completed an apprenticeship program
- 32 approved under chapter 49.04 RCW for the electrical construction
- 33 trade.

- 1 (g) To be eligible to take the examination for a specialty 2 electrician certificate of competency the applicant must have:
- (i) <u>Provided evidence in a form prescribed by the department</u>

 4 affirming that the applicant has met the in-class education
- 5 requirement of section 1 of this act; and
- (ii)(A) Worked in the residential (as specified in WAC 296-46B-7 920(2)(a)), pump and irrigation (as specified in WAC 296-46B-8 920(2)(b)), sign (as specified in WAC 296-46B-920(2)(d)), limited energy (as specified in WAC 296-46B-920(2)(e)), nonresidential maintenance (as specified in WAC 296-46B-920(2)(g)), or other new nonresidential specialties as determined by the department in rule under the supervision of a master journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, or specialty electrician working in that
- 15 electrician's specialty for a minimum of four thousand hours; 16 (((ii)))(B) Worked in the appliance repair specialty as determined 17 by the department in rule, restricted nonresidential maintenance as 18 determined by the department in rule, the equipment repair specialty 19 as determined by the department in rule, the pump and irrigation 20 specialty other than as defined by (g)(i) of this subsection or 21 domestic pump specialty as determined by the department in rule, or a 22 specialty other than the designated specialties in (g)(i) of this 23 subsection for a minimum of the initial ninety days, or longer if set 24 by rule by the department. The restricted nonresidential maintenance 25 specialty is limited to a maximum of 277 volts and 20 amperes for 26 lighting branch circuits and/or a maximum of 250 volts and 60 amperes 27 for other circuits, but excludes the replacement or repair of circuit 28 breakers. The initial period must be spent under one hundred percent 29 supervision of а master journeyman electrician, iourneyman 30 electrician, specialty electrician master working in that 31 electrician's specialty, or specialty electrician working in that 32 electrician's specialty. After this initial period, a person may take 33 the specialty examination. If the person passes the examination, the 34 person may work unsupervised for the balance of the minimum hours

1 required for certification. A person may not be certified as a 2 specialty electrician in the appliance repair specialty or in a 3 specialty other than the designated specialities in (g)(i) of this 4 subsection, however, until the person has worked a minimum of two 5 thousand hours in that specialty, or longer if set by rule by the 6 department;

7 $((\frac{(iii)}{(iii)}))$ Successfully completed an approved apprenticeship 8 program under chapter 49.04 RCW for the applicant's specialty in the 9 electrical construction trade; or

(((iv)))(D) In meeting the training requirements for the pump and 11 irrigation or domestic pump specialties, the individual shall be 12 allowed to obtain the experience required by this section at the same 13 time the individual is meeting the experience required by RCW 14 18.106.040(1)(c). After meeting the training requirements provided in 15 this section, the individual may take the examination and upon passing 16 the examination, meeting additional training requirements as may still 17 be required for those seeking a pump and irrigation, or a domestic 18 pump specialty certificate as defined by rule, and paying the 19 applicable fees, the individual must be issued the appropriate 20 certificate. The department may include an examination for specialty 21 plumbing certificate defined in RCW 18.106.010(10)(c) with the 22 examination required by this section. The department, by rule and in 23 consultation with the electrical board, may establish additional 24 equivalent ways to gain the experience requirements required by this 25 subsection. Individuals who are able to provide evidence to the 26 department, prior to January 1, 2007, that they have been employed as 27 a pump installer in the pump and irrigation or domestic pump business 28 by an appropriately licensed electrical contractor, registered general 29 contractor defined by chapter 18.27 RCW, or appropriate general 30 specialty contractor defined by chapter 18.27 RCW for not less than 31 eight thousand hours in the most recent six calendar years shall be 32 issued the appropriate certificate by the department upon receiving 33 such documentation and applicable fees. The department 34 establish a single document for those who have received both an

- 1 electrical specialty certification as defined by this subsection and 2 have also met the certification requirements for the specialty plumber 3 as defined by RCW 18.106.010(10)(c), showing that the individual has 4 received both certifications. No other experience or training 5 requirements may be imposed.
- (h) Any applicant for a journeyman electrician certificate of 7 competency who has successfully completed a two-year program in the 8 electrical construction trade at public community or technical 9 colleges, or not-for-profit nationally accredited technical or trade 10 schools licensed by the workforce training and education coordinating 11 board under chapter 28C.10 RCW may substitute up to two years of the 12 technical or trade school program for two years of work experience 13 under a master journeyman electrician or journeyman electrician. 14 applicant shall obtain the additional two years of work experience 15 required in industrial or commercial electrical installation prior to 16 the beginning, or after the completion, of the technical school Any applicant who has received training in the electrical 18 construction trade in the armed service of the United States may be 19 eligible to apply armed service work experience towards qualification 20 to take the examination for the journeyman electrician certificate of 21 competency.
- (i) An applicant for a specialty electrician certificate of competency who, after January 1, 2000, has successfully completed a two-year program in the electrical construction trade at a public community or technical college, or a not-for-profit nationally accredited technical or trade school licensed by the workforce training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW, may substitute up to one year of the technical or trade school program for one year of work experience under a master journeyman electrician, journeyman electrician, master specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty, or specialty electrician working in that electrician's specialty. Any applicant who has received training in the electrical construction trade in the armed services of the United States may be eligible to apply armed service work experience towards

- 1 qualification to take the examination for an appropriate specialty 2 electrician certificate of competency.
- (j) The department must determine whether hours of training and 4 experience in the armed services or school program are in the 5 electrical construction trade and appropriate as a substitute for 6 hours of work experience. The department must use the following 7 criteria for evaluating the equivalence of classroom electrical 8 training programs and work in the electrical construction trade:
- 9 (i) A two-year electrical training program must consist of three 10 thousand or more hours.
- (ii) In a two-year electrical training program, a minimum of two thousand four hundred hours of student/instructor contact time must be technical electrical instruction directly related to the scope of work of the electrical specialty. Student/instructor contact time includes lecture and in-school lab.
- 16 (iii) The department may not allow credit for a program that 17 accepts more than one thousand hours transferred from another school's 18 program.
- (iv) Electrical specialty training school programs of less than 20 two years will have all of the above student/instructor contact time 21 hours proportionately reduced. Such programs may not apply to more 22 than fifty percent of the work experience required to attain 23 certification.
- (v) Electrical training programs of less than two years may not be credited towards qualification for journeyman electrician unless the training program is used to gain qualification for a four thousand hour electrical specialty.
- 28 (k) No other requirement for eligibility may be imposed.
- 29 (2) The department shall establish reasonable rules for the 30 examinations to be given applicants for certificates of competency. 31 In establishing the rules, the department shall consult with the 32 board. Upon determination that the applicant is eligible to take the
- 33 examination, the department shall so notify the applicant, indicating
- 33 Chamiliacion, the acparement bharr so notify the approant, inarcating
- 34 the time and place for taking the examination.

1 (3) No noncertified individual may work unsupervised more than one 2 year beyond the date when the trainee would be eligible to test for a 3 certificate of competency if working on a full-time basis after 4 original application for the trainee certificate. For the purposes of 5 this section, full-time basis means two thousand hours."

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Renumber the remaining section consecutively and correct any sinternal references accordingly.

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10 Correct the title.

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<u>EFFECT:</u> Provides that an applicant must provide evidence of meeting the in-class education requirement before taking the examination, rather than before applying to receive a certificate of competency after taking the examination.

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
