- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 19.285 RCW 7 to read as follows:
 - (1) The legislature finds that thermal energy resources are an important part of the state's energy strategy, and that renewable thermal energy is a useful alternative to fossil-fueled thermal energy.
 - (2) Eliqible renewable energy resources do not have to be converted to electricity for purposes of receiving renewable energy credits. rules must specify the quantity of energy derived from an eligible renewable energy resource that is equal to one megawatt hour of electricity, including that one megawatt hour equals 3,412,142 British thermal units.
