- AN ACT Relating to apportionments to educational service districts and school districts for the 2010-11 school year; amending RCW
- 3 28A.510.250; and declaring an emergency.

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- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.510.250 and 1990 c 33 s 426 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
 - (1) On or before the last business day of September 1969 and each month thereafter, the superintendent of public instruction shall apportion from the state general fund to the several educational service districts of the state the proportional share of the total annual amount due and apportionable to such educational service districts for the school districts thereof as follows:

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10 The annual amount due and apportionable shall be the amount apportionable for all apportionment credits estimated to accrue to the 11 schools during the apportionment year beginning September first and 12 continuing through August thirty-first. Appropriations made for school 13 14 districts for each year of a biennium shall be apportioned according to 15 the schedule set forth in this section for the fiscal year starting 16 September 1st of the then calendar year and ending August 31st of the next calendar year, except as provided in subsection (2) of this 17 section. (2) In the 2010-11 school year, the June apportionment payment to school districts shall be reduced by one hundred twenty-eight million

- 3 This July 1st payment shall be in addition to the regularly calculated

- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act is necessary for the immediate
- 6 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the
- 7 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect
- 8 immediately.

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
