1 AN ACT Relating to the uniform interstate depositions and discovery 2 act; and adding a new chapter to Title 5 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. SHORT TITLE. This act may be known and 5 cited as the uniform interstate depositions and discovery act.

6 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

7 (1) "Foreign jurisdiction" means a state other than Washington 8 state.

9 (2) "Foreign subpoena" means a subpoena issued under authority of 10 a court of record of a foreign jurisdiction.

(3) "Person" means an individual, corporation, business trust, 11 12 estate, trust, partnership, limited liability company, association, 13 public corporation, government, or joint venture, governmental 14 subdivision, agency or instrumentality, or any other leqal or 15 commercial entity.

16 (4) "State" means a state of the United States, the District of17 Columbia, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin Islands, a federally

recognized Indian tribe, or any territory or insular possession subject
 to the jurisdiction of the United States.

3 (5) "Subpoena" means a document, however denominated, issued under
4 authority of a court of record requiring a person to:

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(a) Attend and give testimony at a deposition;

(b) Produce and permit inspection and copying of designated books,
documents, records, electronically stored information, or tangible
things in the possession, custody, or control of the person; or

9 (c) Permit inspection of premises under the control of the person.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. ISSUANCE OF SUBPOENA. (1) To request 11 issuance of a subpoena under this section, a party must submit a 12 foreign subpoena to a clerk of court in the county in which discovery 13 is sought to be conducted in this state. A request for the issuance of 14 a subpoena under this chapter does not constitute an appearance in the 15 courts of Washington state.

16 (2) When a party submits a foreign subpoena to a clerk of court in 17 this state, the clerk, in accordance with that court's procedure, shall 18 promptly issue a subpoena for service upon the person to which the 19 foreign subpoena is directed.

(3) A subpoena under subsection (2) of this section must:

(a) Incorporate the terms used in the foreign subpoena; and

(b) Contain or be accompanied by the names, addresses, and
telephone numbers of all counsel of record in the proceeding to which
the subpoena relates and of any party not represented by counsel.

25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. SERVICE OF SUBPOENA. A subpoena issued by 26 a clerk of court under section 3 of this act must be served in 27 compliance with superior court civil rule (CR) 45.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. DEPOSITION, PRODUCTION, AND INSPECTION.
 Superior court civil rules (CR) 26 through 37 apply to subpoenas issued
 under section 3 of this act.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. APPLICATION TO COURT. An application to the 32 court for a protective order or to enforce, quash, or modify a subpoena 33 issued by a clerk of court under section 3 of this act must comply with

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1 the rules or statutes of Washington state and be submitted to the court 2 in the county in which discovery is to be conducted.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. UNIFORMITY OF APPLICATION AND CONSTRUCTION. 4 In applying and construing this chapter, consideration must be given to 5 the need to promote uniformity of the law with respect to its subject 6 matter among states that enact this chapter.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 8. APPLICATION TO PENDING ACTIONS. This
chapter applies to requests for discovery in cases pending on the
effective date of this act.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 9.** Sections 1 through 8 of this act constitute 11 a new chapter in Title 5 RCW.

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
