- 1 AN ACT Relating to extending the time period for voter 2 registration; amending RCW 29A.08.140; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes that the right to vote is a fundamental right of citizens. The legislature also recognizes that voter turnout is statistically better in states that allow election day registration. In the 2008 presidential election,
- 8 the average voter turnout for states with election day registration was
- 9 sixty-nine percent, compared to sixty-two percent for all other states.
- 10 Nine states have enacted election day registration. Therefore, it is
- 11 the intent of the legislature to increase voter turnout by enacting
- 12 election day registration.
- 13 **Sec. 2.** RCW 29A.08.140 and 2011 c 10 s 15 are each amended to read 14 as follows:
- 15 (1) In order to vote in any primary, special election, or general election, a person who is not registered to vote in Washington must:
- 17 (a) Submit a registration application no later than twenty-nine

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days before the day of the primary, special election, or general election; $((\frac{\partial \mathbf{r}}{\partial \mathbf{r}}))$

- (b) Register in person at the county auditor's office, or other location designated by the county auditor, in his or her county of residence no later than ((eight days before)) 5:00 p.m. on the day of the primary, special election, or general election; or
- (c) Submit an online application no later than eight days before the day of the primary, special election, or general election.
- (2) A person who is already registered to vote in Washington may update his or her registration no later than twenty-nine days before the day of the primary, special election, or general election to be in effect for that primary, special election, or general election. A registered voter who fails to transfer his or her residential address by this deadline may vote according to his or her previous registration address.

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
