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## SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6249

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State of Washington 62nd Legislature 2012 Regular Session

By Senate Labor, Commerce & Consumer Protection (originally sponsored by Senators Kohl-Welles, Regala, McAuliffe, Keiser, Murray, and Conway) READ FIRST TIME 01/31/12.

- 1 AN ACT Relating to tanning facilities; adding a new chapter to 2 Title 18 RCW; and prescribing penalties.
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- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
  - (1) "Department" means the department of health.
  - (2) "Phototherapy device" means equipment that emits ultraviolet radiation used by a health care professional in the treatment of disease.
- 10 (3) "Tanning device" means an ultraviolet tanning device and any 11 accompanying equipment including, but not limited to, protective 12 eyewear, timers, and handrails.
- 13 (4) "Tanning facility" means any location, place, area, structure, 14 or business that provides persons access to any tanning device.
- (5) "Ultraviolet tanning device" means equipment that emits electromagnetic radiation with wavelengths in the air between 200 and 400 nanometers used for tanning of the skin including, but not limited to, a sunlamp, tanning booth, or tanning bed.

- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This chapter does not apply to a
- 2 phototherapy device used by or under the direct supervision of a
- 3 licensed physician who is trained in the use of phototherapy devices.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** Any tanning device used by a tanning
- 5 facility shall comply with all applicable federal laws and regulations.
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** (1) A tanning facility shall conspicuously
- 7 post a warning sign in any area where an ultraviolet tanning device is
- 8 used that is readily visible to a person using an ultraviolet tanning
- 9 device. The sign must read as follows:
- 10 DANGER: ULTRAVIOLET RADIATION
- 11 1. Follow instructions.
- 12 2. Avoid too frequent or too lengthy exposure. As with natural
- 13 sunlight, exposure can cause eye and skin injury and allergic
- 14 reactions. Repeated exposure may cause skin cancer and chronic sun
- 15 damage characterized by wrinkling, dryness, fragility, and bruising of
- 16 the skin.
- 3. Wear protective eyewear.
- 18 FAILURE TO USE PROTECTIVE EYEWEAR MAY RESULT IN SEVERE BURNS OR
- 19 LONG-TERM INJURY TO THE EYES.
- 20 4. Ultraviolet radiation from sunlamps will aggravate the effects
- 21 of the sun. Therefore, do not sunbathe before or after exposure to
- 22 ultraviolet radiation.
- 5. Medications or cosmetics may increase your sensitivity to
- 24 ultraviolet radiation. Consult a physician before using a sunlamp if
- 25 you are using medications, have a history of skin problems, or believe
- 26 you are especially sensitive to sunlight. Pregnant women or women on
- 27 birth control pills who use this product may develop discolored skin.
- 28 IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO ACHIEVE A TAN IN THE SUN YOU WILL NOT TAN FROM
- 29 USE OF THIS DEVICE.
- 30 6. If you have a health or safety complaint about this tanning
- 31 facility, or to report use of the tanning facility by persons under
- 32 eighteen years of age, such complaint should be directed to the

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- (2) A tanning facility may include in the warning sign described in subsection (1) of this section the following statement: "Spray on tans and other sunless tanning products are not subject to the same effects as ultraviolet tanning devices."
  - (3) A tanning facility may not claim, or distribute promotional materials that claim, using an ultraviolet tanning device is safe or free from risk or that indoor tanning has any known health benefits.
- 10 (4) The liability of a tanning facility operator or a manufacturer 11 of an ultraviolet tanning device is not changed by posting the warning 12 under this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. (1) Persons under eighteen years of age are prohibited from using an ultraviolet tanning device.
- 15 (2) Proof of age must be satisfied with a driver's license or other 16 government-issued identification containing the date of birth and a 17 photograph of the individual.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. (1) A tanning facility shall forward all customer health and safety complaints to the department. The tanning facility shall submit the complaint within five days after the date the complaint was received.
- 22 (2) The department must create and submit a complaint report to the legislature annually, beginning December 1, 2013.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. (1) A first violation of this chapter is a class 1 infraction. Each day a first violation continues constitutes a separate infraction.
- 27 (2) Any violation of this chapter subsequent to a first violation 28 is a misdemeanor under RCW 9A.20.021. Each day a subsequent violation 29 continues constitutes a separate misdemeanor.
- 30 (3) A tanning facility that has violated this chapter is liable for 31 a civil penalty not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars per day 32 in addition to any other penalty established by law.
