AN ACT Relating to establishing a processing fee for educator certificates and subsequent actions; adding a new section to chapter 3 28A.410 RCW; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.410 6 RCW to read as follows:

7 (1) The legislature finds that the current economic environment 8 requires that the state, when appropriate, charge for some of the services provided directly to the users of those services. 9 The office 10 of the superintendent of public instruction is currently supported with 11 state funds to process certification fees. In addition, the 12 legislature finds that the processing of certifications should be moved that allows 13 an online system educators to manage their to 14 certifications and provides better information to policymakers. The 15 legislature intends to assess a certification processing fee to eliminate state-funded 16 support of the cost to issue educator certificates. 17

18 (2) In addition to the certification fee established under RCW19 28A.410.060, the superintendent of public instruction shall charge an

application processing fee for initial educator certificates and subsequent actions. The superintendent of public instruction shall establish the amount of the fee by rule under chapter 34.05 RCW. The superintendent shall set the fee at a sufficient level to defray the costs of administering the educator certification program under RCW 28A.300.040(9). Revenue generated through the processing fee shall be deposited in the educator certification program.

(3) The educator certification processing account is established in 8 the custody of the state treasurer. The superintendent of public 9 instruction shall deposit in the account all moneys received from the 10 fees collected in subsection (2) of this section. Moneys in the 11 account may be spent only for the processing of educator certificates 12 13 and subsequent actions. Disbursements from the account shall be on authorization of the superintendent of public instruction or the 14 superintendent's designee. The account is subject to the allotment 15 procedure provided under chapter 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is 16 17 required for disbursements.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 19 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 20 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 21 July 1, 2011.
