AN ACT Relating to authorizing public utility districts to request voluntary contributions to assist low-income customers with payment of water and sewer bills; and amending RCW 54.52.010.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 54.52.010 and 2007 c 132 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:

7 (1) A public utility district may include along with, or as part 8 of, its regular customer billings $((\tau))$ a request for voluntary contributions to assist qualified low-income residential customers of 9 10 the district in paying their electricity bills. All funds received by the district in response to such requests shall be $\left(\left(\frac{1}{1}\right)\right)$ (a) 11 12 transmitted (((a))) (i) to the grantee of the department of ((community, - trade, - and - economic - development)) 13 commerce which 14 administers federally funded energy assistance programs for the state 15 in the district's service area or (((b))) (ii) to a charitable 16 organization within the district's service area; or $\left(\left(\frac{2}{2}\right)\right)$ (b) 17 retained by the district. All such funds shall be used solely to supplement assistance to low-income residential customers of the 18 19 district in paying their electricity bills. The grantee, charitable

1 organization, or district is responsible to determine which of the 2 district's customers are qualified for low-income assistance and the 3 amount of assistance to be provided to those who are qualified.

(2) A public utility district may include with or as part of its 4 regular_customer_billings, a request for voluntary contributions to 5 assist qualified low-income residential customers of the district in 6 paying their water and sewer bills. All funds received by the district 7 as a result of these requests shall be transmitted to a charitable 8 organization_within_the_district's_service_area_or_retained_by_the 9 district <u>and</u> <u>distributed</u> <u>solely</u> <u>to</u> <u>assist</u> <u>gualified</u> <u>low-income</u> 10 residential customers in paying their water and sewer bills. The 11 charitable organization or district is responsible for determining 12 13 which of the district's customers are qualified to receive low-income 14 assistance and the amount of assistance provided to qualified 15 customers.
