1 AN ACT Relating to special license plates; reenacting and amending
2 RCW 46.18.200, 46.17.220, 46.68.420, and 46.18.060; adding new sections
3 to chapter 46.04 RCW; and providing an effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2011 c 229 s 1, 2011 c 225 s 1, and 2011
6 c 171 s 69 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

7 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the
8 department:

9 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized license
10 plates for vehicles required to display one and two license plates
11 unless otherwise specified;

12 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the
13 department;

14 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter 46.87
15 RCW; and

16 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

17 (2) The department approves and shall issue the following special
18 license plates:

13 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
14 and paramedics special license plates must show proof eligibility by
15 providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington state
16 council of firefighters.

17 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
18 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
19 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) have
20 documentation of service from the district of the appropriate fire
21 service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting service
22 before ten years of service have been completed, the volunteer
23 firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the department on the
24 registration renewal date. If the volunteer firefighter stays in
25 service for at least ten years and then leaves, the license plate may
26 be retained by the former volunteer firefighter and as long as the
27 license plate is retained for use the person will continue to pay the
28 future registration renewals. A qualifying volunteer firefighter may
29 have no more than one set of license plates per vehicle, and a maximum
30 of two sets per applicant, for their personal vehicles. If the
31 volunteer firefighter is convicted of a violation of RCW 46.61.502 or
32 a felony, the license plates must be surrendered upon conviction.

33 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW
34 to read as follows:

35 "4-H license plates" means special license plates issued under RCW
36 46.18.200 that display the "4-H" logo.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW
2 to read as follows:

3 "State flower license plates" means special license plates issued
4 under RCW 46.18.200 that display the Washington state flower.

5 **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2011 c 229 s 3, 2011 c 225 s 2, and 2011
6 c 171 s 58 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

7 (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon
8 application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the
9 holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special
10 license plate fee as listed in this section.

19 (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for the
20 sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds must be
21 distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and
22 interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball
23 stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary
24 preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW
25 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds
26 to the state general fund.

27 **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2011 c 229 s 4, 2011 c 225 s 3, and 2011
28 c 171 s 87 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

29 (1) The department shall:

30 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW
31 46.17.220;

32 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial issue
33 and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and collection
34 expenses incurred by it; and

35 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
36 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

1 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor
2 vehicle account until the department determines that the state has been
3 reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license plate.
4 Upon determination by the department that the state has been
5 reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special
6 license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the
7 following appropriate account as created in this section in the custody
8 of the state treasurer:

20 (3) Only the director or the director's designee may authorize
21 expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this
22 section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under
23 chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for
24 expenditures.

25 (4) Funds in the special license plate accounts described in
26 subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the
27 conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under
28 contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations
29 that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.

30 (5) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit
31 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in
32 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status under
33 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization must
34 meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

35 **Sec. 6.** RCW 46.18.060 and 2011 c 367 s 703, 2011 c 229 s 5, 2011

1 c 225 s 4, and 2011 c 171 s 66 are each reenacted and amended to read
2 as follows:

3 (1) The department must review and either approve or reject special
4 license plate applications submitted by sponsoring organizations.

5 (2) Duties of the department include, but are not limited to, the
6 following:

7 (a) Review and approve the annual financial reports submitted by
8 sponsoring organizations with active special license plate series and
9 present those annual financial reports to the joint transportation
10 committee;

11 (b) Report annually to the joint transportation committee on the
12 special license plate applications that were considered by the
13 department;

14 (c) Issue approval and rejection notification letters to sponsoring
15 organizations, the executive committee of the joint transportation
16 committee, and the legislative sponsors identified in each application.
17 The letters must be issued within seven days of making a determination
18 on the status of an application; and

19 (d) Review annually the number of plates sold for each special
20 license plate series created after January 1, 2003. The department may
21 submit a recommendation to discontinue a special plate series to the
22 executive committee of the joint transportation committee.

23 (3) Except as provided in RCW 46.18.245, in order to assess the
24 effects and impact of the proliferation of special license plates, the
25 legislature declares a temporary moratorium on the issuance of any
26 additional plates until July 1, 2013. During this period of time, the
27 department is prohibited from accepting, reviewing, processing, or
28 approving any applications. Additionally, a special license plate may
29 not be enacted by the legislature during the moratorium, unless the
30 proposed license plate has been approved by the former special license
31 plate review board before February 15, 2005.

35 ~~(5) The Music Matters license plates created under RCW 46.18.200

2 (b) Music Matters license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;
3 (c) State flower license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;
4 (d) Volunteer firefighter license plates created under RCW
5 46.18.200.
