Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

3 "<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 43.70 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 (1) Persons licensed as health care professionals in another state 6 or territory of the United States or the District of Columbia, but not 7 licensed by a disciplining authority specified in RCW 18.130.040, may 8 practice in this state on a limited voluntary basis only as provided in 9 this section.

10 (2) The volunteer health care professional's license must be for a 11 profession substantially equivalent to a profession regulated by a 12 disciplining authority listed in RCW 18.130.040.

13 (3) At least thirty days prior to the first day of volunteer 14 practice, the volunteer health care professional must submit to the 15 department an attestation that includes, but is not limited to, the 16 following:

(a) A confirmation that the health care professional holds an
active license to practice in any state or territory of the United
States or the District of Columbia;

20 (b) A confirmation that the health care professional is not 21 presently subject to any disciplinary action or investigation for 22 criminal or professional misconduct in any jurisdiction;

(c) An acknowledgment that the health care professional understands he or she may perform only within the relevant professional scope of practice permitted under Washington law, or state of licensure, whichever is more restrictive;

(d) A confirmation that the health care professional has not volunteered in Washington for more than thirty days in the current calendar year;

(e) The contact information of the organization sponsoring the 1 2 medical clinic or health care event, if any; and

(f) Anticipated volunteer practice dates.

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(4) The attestation must be made on a form established by the 4 5 secretary.

(5) Neither the volunteer health care professional nor the б 7 organization sponsoring a medical clinic or health care event, if any, 8 may charge for any time or services performed in Washington. However, organizations sponsoring a medical clinic or health care event may pay 9 10 or reimburse the volunteer health care professional for actual incurred travel costs. 11

12 (6) No health care professional permitted to practice in Washington 13 under this section may volunteer more than thirty days in any calendar 14 year.

(7) Any organization sponsoring a medical clinic or health care 15 event using the services of any volunteer health care professional 16 17 permitted to practice under this section must:

(a) Independently verify each requirement in subsection (3) of this 18 section for each volunteer health care professional and retain proof of 19 verification for two years after the last day of the medical clinic or 20 21 health care event;

22 (b) Maintain the health care records of all patients evaluated or 23 treated by a volunteer health care professional in compliance with 24 chapter 70.02 RCW; and

(c) Ensure the health care records of all patients evaluated or 25 treated by a volunteer health care professional are accessible to 26 27 future health care professionals, if needed, in compliance with chapter 28 70.02 RCW.

(8) This section does not create any civil liability on the part of 29 the state or any state agency, officer, employee, or agent." 30

> EFFECT: (1) Removes the provision for an attestation to be submitted after the enumerated deadline during a state of emergency.

(2) Removes the provision allowing volunteers to have their travel costs reimbursed during a state of emergency.

(3) Removes the provision allowing volunteer health care professionals to practice more than thirty days in a calendar year in response to a declared state of emergency.

(4) Changes the content of the acknowledgment that the professional must submit; instead of acknowledging that he or she may not perform outside of the scope permitted under Washington law, the professional must acknowledge that he or she may perform only within the scope allowed in Washington or his or her state of licensure, whichever is more restrictive.

(5) Ensures that all health care records are managed in accordance with chapter 70.02 RCW.

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
