(1)The superintendent of public entities consultation with the listed 5 instruction, in in RCW 6 28A.230.125; the student achievement council; the educational 7 opportunity oversight and accountability committee; gap and 8 representatives of associations organizations or representing 9 teachers, principals, school administrators, school directors, and 10 parents, shall consider the feasibility of assigning additional weight 11 on the standardized high school transcript to advanced placement (AP) 12 and higher level international baccalaureate (IB) courses for purposes 13 of calculating a high school student's grade point average. 14 superintendent shall examine options for a common calculation 15 methodology, advantages and disadvantages, and a possible timeframe 16 for implementation. The superintendent shall submit the analysis and 17 recommendations to the education committees of the legislature by 18 December 1, 2014.
- 19 After completing the analysis under subsection (1) of this 20 section, the superintendent, in consultation with the entities and 21 representatives listed under subsection (1) of this section, shall 22 consider the feasibility of also assigning additional weight on the 23 standardized high school transcript to courses completed through the 24 running start program in RCW 28A.600.300 for purposes of calculating 25 a high school student's grade point average. The superintendent 26 shall examine advantages and disadvantages, the comparability of 27 running start courses to ΑP and ΙB courses, options for a

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Correct the title.

EFFECT: Replaces the requirement to develop a common methodology for assigning weight to AP and IB courses on the standardized high school transcript. Instead, directs the Superintendent of Public Instruction (SPI), in consultation with the public colleges and universities, other education agencies, the Educational Opportunity Gap Oversight and Accountability Committee, and education associations, to examine the feasibility of assigning additional weight on the transcript to AP and IB courses. Requires the analysis and recommendations to be submitted to the Education Committees by December 1, 2014.

After the first analysis is completed, directs the SPI, in consultation with the same entities, to examine the feasibility of also assigning additional weight on the transcript to Running Start courses. Requires the analysis to include the comparability of Running Start courses to AP and IB courses and options for a calculation methodology compared to the methodology recommended for AP and IB courses. Requires the analysis and recommendations to be submitted to the Education Committees by December 1, 2015.

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
