3 "<u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** DEFINITION. The definition in this section 4 applies throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires 5 otherwise.

Person" means an individual, corporation, business trust, estate,
trust, partnership, association, joint venture, or other legal or
commercial entity. The term does not include a government or
governmental subdivision, agency, or instrumentality.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. SCOPE. (1) This chapter applies to any 11 claim for relief, however characterized, for damages arising out of 12 harm caused by the false content of a publication that is published on 13 or after the effective date of this section.

14 (2) This chapter applies to all publications, including writings,
 15 broadcasts, oral communications, electronic transmissions, or other
 16 forms of transmitting information.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. REQUEST FOR CORRECTION OR CLARIFICATION.
18 (1) A person may maintain an action for defamation only if:

(a) The person has made a timely and adequate request forcorrection or clarification from the defendant; or

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(b) The defendant has made a correction or clarification.

(2) A request for correction or clarification is timely if made within the period of limitation for commencement of an action for defamation. However, a person who, within ninety days after knowledge of the publication, fails to make a good-faith attempt to request a correction or clarification may not recover damages for injury to reputation or presumed damages; however, the person may recover all other damages permitted by law. 1 (3) A request for correction or clarification is adequate if it:

2 (a) Is made in writing and reasonably identifies the person making3 the request;

4 (b) Specifies with particularity the statement alleged to be false 5 and defamatory and, to the extent known, the time and place of 6 publication;

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(c) Alleges the defamatory meaning of the statement;

8 (d) Specifies the circumstances giving rise to any defamatory 9 meaning of the statement which arises from other than the express 10 language of the publication; and

11 (e) States that the alleged defamatory meaning of the statement is 12 false.

13 (4) In the absence of a previous adequate request, service of a 14 summons and complaint stating a claim for relief for defamation and 15 containing the information required in subsection (3) of this section 16 constitutes an adequate request for correction or clarification.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. DISCLOSURE OF EVIDENCE OF FALSITY. (1) A 18 person who has been requested to make a correction or clarification may 19 ask the requester to disclose reasonably available information material 20 to the falsity of the allegedly defamatory statement.

(2) If a correction or clarification is not made, a person who unreasonably fails to disclose the information after a request to do so may not recover damages for injury to reputation or presumed damages; however, the person may recover all other damages permitted by law.

25 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. EFFECT OF CORRECTION OR CLARIFICATION. If 26 a timely and sufficient correction or clarification is made, a person 27 may not recover damages for injury to reputation or presumed damages; 28 however, the person may recover all other damages permitted by law as 29 well as reasonable expenses of litigation, including attorneys' fees 30 incurred before the publication of the correction or clarification.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. TIMELY AND SUFFICIENT CORRECTION OR 32 CLARIFICATION. (1) A correction or clarification is timely if it is 33 published before, or within one month after, receipt of a request for 34 correction or clarification or of the information in section 4(1) of 1 this act, whichever is later, unless the period is extended by written 2 agreement of the parties.

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(2) A correction or clarification is sufficient if it:

4 (a) Is published with a prominence and in a manner and medium
5 reasonably likely to reach substantially the same audience as the
6 publication complained of;

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(b) Refers to the statement being corrected or clarified and:

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(i) Corrects the statement;

9 (ii) In the case of defamatory meaning arising from other than the 10 express language of the publication, disclaims an intent to communicate 11 that meaning or to assert its truth; or

12 (iii) In the case of a statement attributed to another person, 13 identifies the person and disclaims an intent to assert the truth of 14 the statement;

15 (c) Is communicated to the person who has made a request for 16 correction or clarification; and

(d) Accompanies and is an equally prominent part of any electronicpublication of the allegedly defamatory statement by the publisher.

19 (3) A correction or clarification is published in a medium 20 reasonably likely to reach substantially the same audience as the 21 publication complained of if it is published in a later issue, edition, 22 or broadcast of the original publication.

(4) If a later issue, edition, or broadcast of the original publication will not be published within the time limits established for a timely correction or clarification, a correction or clarification is published in a manner and medium reasonably likely to reach substantially the same audience as the publication complained of if:

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(a) It is timely published in a reasonably prominent manner:

(i) In another medium likely to reach an audience reasonablyequivalent to the original publication; or

(ii) If the parties cannot agree on another medium, in the newspaper with the largest general circulation in the region in which the original publication was distributed;

34 (b) Reasonable steps are taken to correct undistributed copies of35 the original publication, if any; and

36 (c) It is published in the next practicable issue, edition, or37 broadcast, if any, of the original publication.

(5) A correction or clarification is timely and sufficient if the
 parties agree in writing that it is timely and sufficient.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. CHALLENGES TO CORRECTION OR CLARIFICATION OR 3 TO REQUEST FOR CORRECTION OR CLARIFICATION. (1) If a defendant in an 4 action governed by this chapter intends to rely on a timely and 5 sufficient correction or clarification, the defendant's intention to do б 7 so, and the correction or clarification relied upon, must be set forth in a notice served on the plaintiff within sixty days after service of 8 9 the summons and complaint or ten days after the correction or clarification is made, whichever is later. 10 A correction or clarification is deemed to be timely and sufficient unless the 11 12 plaintiff challenges its timeliness or sufficiency within twenty days after the notice is served. 13

14 (2) If a defendant in an action governed by this chapter intends to 15 challenge the adequacy or timeliness of a request for correction or 16 clarification, the defendant must set forth the challenge in a motion 17 to declare the request inadequate or untimely served within sixty days 18 after service of the summons and complaint. The court shall rule on 19 the motion at the earliest appropriate time before trial.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. OFFER TO CORRECT OR CLARIFY. (1) If a 21 timely correction or clarification is no longer possible, the publisher 22 of an alleged defamatory statement may offer, at any time before trial, 23 to make a correction or clarification. The offer must be made in 24 writing to the person allegedly defamed by the publication and:

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(a) Contain the publisher's offer to:

26 (i) Publish, at the person's request, a sufficient correction or 27 clarification; and

(ii) Pay the person's reasonable expenses of litigation, including attorneys' fees, incurred before publication of the correction or clarification; and

31 (b) Be accompanied by a copy of the proposed correction or 32 clarification and the plan for its publication.

(2) If the person accepts in writing an offer to correct or clarifymade pursuant to subsection (1) of this section:

35 (a) The person is barred from commencing an action against the36 publisher based on the statement; or

1 (b) If an action has been commenced, the court shall dismiss the 2 action against the defendant with prejudice after the defendant 3 complies with the terms of the offer.

4 (3) A person who does not accept an offer made in conformance with subsection (1) of this section may not recover damages for injury to 5 reputation or presumed damages in an action based on the statement; б 7 however, the person may recover all other damages permitted by law, as 8 well as reasonable expenses of litigation, including attorneys' fees, incurred before the offer, unless the person failed to make a good-9 10 faith attempt to request a correction or clarification in accordance with section 3(2) of this act or failed to disclose information in 11 12 accordance with section 4 of this act.

(4) On request of either party, a court shall promptly determinethe sufficiency of the offered correction or clarification.

15 NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. SCOPE OF PROTECTION. A timely and 16 sufficient correction or clarification made by a person responsible for a publication constitutes a correction or clarification made by all 17 persons responsible for that publication other than a republisher. 18 However, a correction or clarification that is sufficient only because 19 20 of the operation of section 6(2)(b)(iii) of this act does not 21 constitute a correction or clarification made by the person to whom the 22 statement is attributed.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 10. UNIFORMITY OF APPLICATION AND CONSTRUCTION. 24 This chapter shall be applied and construed to effectuate its general 25 purpose to make uniform the law with respect to the subject of this 26 chapter among states enacting it.

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 11. SHORT TITLE. This chapter may be known and 28 cited as the uniform correction or clarification of defamation act.

29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 12.** If any provision of this act or its 30 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 31 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 32 persons or circumstances is not affected. <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 13. Sections 1 through 11 of this act
 constitute a new chapter in Title 7 RCW."
