1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 2 following:

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4 The legislature finds that regulatory "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 5 processes impose significant costs on doing business and significantly 6 influence investment behavior, location decisions, start-up activity, 7 expansions, and hiring. The legislature further finds that, for more 8 than a decade, the executive and legislative branches have called upon 9 state agencies to review their regulations to achieve meaningful 10 regulatory reform and improve the regulatory climate for Washington 11 businesses. However, a 2012 performance audit conducted by the state 12 auditor's office found that the departments of ecology, health, and 13 labor and industries have not adopted sufficient streamlining 14 processes or formally measured the results of their streamlining 15 activities. Thus, it is the intent of the legislature to formally 16 direct these three state agencies to achieve the regulatory reform 17 that has been repeatedly called for by the governor and the 18 legislature.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 43.21A 21 RCW to read as follows:
- The department of ecology must establish a continuous, formal review process of its rules. The review must be based on a
- 24 prioritized work plan and must include rules relating to licenses,
- 25 permits, and inspections. The review must identify rules that can
- 26 be simplified, amended, or repealed with a goal to reduce the
- 27 regulatory burden on businesses without compromising the public

1 health or safety. Performance measures must be adopted to assess 2 the effectiveness of streamlining efforts. The department must 3 establish a process for effectively applying sunset provisions to 4 rules when applicable. The department must present an update to the 5 applicable committees of the legislature regarding its review 6 process, performance measures, and accomplishments of its 7 streamlining efforts by January 2014, and every other year 8 thereafter.

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NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 43.22 RCW 11 to read as follows:

12 labor and industries The department of must establish 13 continuous, formal review process of its rules. The review must be 14 based on a prioritized work plan and must include rules relating to 15 licenses, permits, and inspections. The review must identify rules 16 that can be simplified, amended, or repealed with a goal to reduce 17 the regulatory burden on businesses without compromising the public 18 health or safety. Performance measures must be adopted to assess 19 the effectiveness of streamlining efforts. The department must 20 establish a process for effectively applying sunset provisions to 21 rules when applicable. The department must present an update to the 22 applicable committees of the legislature regarding its review 23 process, performance measures, and accomplishments of its 24 streamlining efforts by January 2014, and every other year 25 thereafter.

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NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 43.70 RCW 28 to read as follows:

The department of health must establish a continuous, formal review process of its rules. The review must be based on a prioritized work plan and must include rules relating to licenses, permits, and inspections. The review must identify rules that can be simplified, amended, or repealed with a goal to reduce the regulatory burden on businesses without compromising the public

1 health or safety. Performance measures must be adopted to assess 2 the effectiveness of streamlining efforts. The department must 3 establish a process for effectively applying sunset provisions to 4 rules when applicable. The department must present an update to the 5 applicable committees of the legislature regarding its review 6 process, performance measures, and accomplishments of its 7 streamlining efforts by January 2014, and every other year 8 thereafter."

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EFFECT: Requires that the formal review process be a continuous process. Requires that the review be based on a prioritized work plan and include rules relating to licenses, permits, and inspections. Requires that the review identify rules that can be simplified, amended, or repealed. Requires each department to present an update to the applicable committees of the Legislature regarding its review process, performance measures, and accomplishments of its streamlining efforts by January 2014 and every other year thereafter.

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
