<u>SB 6338</u> - H AMD 936 By Representative Zeiger

Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:

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4 "Sec. 1. RCW 43.185.070 and 2013 c 145 s 3 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (1) During each calendar year in which funds from the housing 7 trust fund or other legislative appropriations are available for use 8 by the department for the housing assistance program, the department 9 must announce to all known interested parties, and through major media 10 throughout the state, a grant and loan application period of at least 11 ninety days' duration. This announcement must be made as often as the 12 director deems appropriate for proper utilization of resources. The 13 department must then promptly grant as many applications as will 14 utilize available funds less appropriate administrative costs of the 15 department as provided in RCW 43.185.050.

16 (2) In awarding funds under this chapter, the department must:

17 (a) Provide for a geographic distribution on a statewide basis;18 and

(b) Until June 30, 2013, consider the total cost and per-unit cost of each project for which an application is submitted for funding under RCW 43.185.050(2) (a) and (j), as compared to similar housing projects constructed or renovated within the same geographic area.

(3) The department, with advice and input from the affordable housing advisory board established in RCW 43.185B.020, or a subcommittee of the affordable housing advisory board, must report recommendations for awarding funds in a cost-effective manner. The report must include an implementation plan, timeline, and any other 1 items the department identifies as important to consider to the 2 legislature by December 1, 2012.

3 (4) The department must give first priority to applications for 4 projects and activities which utilize existing privately owned housing 5 stock including privately owned housing stock purchased by nonprofit 6 public development authorities and public housing authorities as 7 created in chapter 35.82 RCW. As used in this subsection, privately 8 owned housing stock includes housing that is acquired by a federal 9 agency through a default on the mortgage by the private owner. Such 10 projects and activities must be evaluated under subsection (5) of this 11 section. Second priority must be given to activities and projects 12 which utilize existing publicly owned housing stock. All projects and 13 activities must be evaluated by some or all of the criteria under 14 subsection (5) of this section, and similar projects and activities 15 shall be evaluated under the same criteria.

16 (5) The department must give preference for applications based on 17 some or all of the criteria under this subsection, and similar 18 projects and activities must be evaluated under the same criteria:

19 (a) The degree of leveraging of other funds that will occur;

20 (b) The degree of commitment from programs to provide necessary 21 habilitation and support services for projects focusing on special 22 needs populations;

(c) Recipient contributions to total project costs, including
24 allied contributions from other sources such as professional, craft
25 and trade services, and lender interest rate subsidies;

26 (d) Local government project contributions in the form of 27 infrastructure improvements, and others;

(e) Projects that encourage ownership, management, and other29 project-related responsibility opportunities;

30 (f) Projects that demonstrate a strong probability of serving the 31 original target group or income level for a period of at least twenty-32 five years;

33 (g) The applicant has the demonstrated ability, stability and 34 resources to implement the project;

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1 (h) Projects which demonstrate serving the greatest need;

2 (i) Projects that provide housing for persons and families with3 the lowest incomes;

4 (j) Projects serving special needs populations which are under5 statutory mandate to develop community housing;

6 (k) Project location and access to employment centers in the 7 region or area;

8 (1) Projects that provide employment and training opportunities 9 for disadvantaged youth under a youthbuild or youthbuild-type program 10 as defined in RCW 50.72.020; ((and))

11 (m) Project location and access to available public transportation 12 services; and

13 (n) Projects involving collaborative partnerships with local 14 school districts that help children of low-income families succeed in 15 school.

16 (6) The department may only approve applications for projects for 17 persons with mental illness that are consistent with a regional 18 support network six-year capital and operating plan."

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EFFECT: Allows a preference for projects that involve partnerships between school districts and any eligible organization, rather than only with housing authorities.

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
