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On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "Relating to" strike the remainder of the title and insert "pharmacy benefit managers regarding registration, audits and maximum allowable cost standards; and adding new chapter to Title 19; and adding a new section to chapter 19.02 RCW."

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## EFFECT:

- Moves the registration from the Department of Licensing to the Department of Revenue
- Adds a phone number for the PBM to the registration information
- Directs registration fees to be deposited into the business license account in DOR
- Aligns the drug list with Oregon law, allowing a drug to be on the maximum allowable cost "MAC" list if there are two therapeutically equivalent drugs or at least one generic drug available
- Amends the title to more clearly reflect the focus on PBM registration, audits and maximum allowable cost standards and to establish a new chapter in Title 19 business regulations

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
