# Background:

The state government operates on a fiscal biennium that begins on July 1 of each oddnumbered year. Supplemental budgets frequently are enacted in each of the following two years after adoption of the biennial budget. Appropriations are made in the biennial and supplemental transportation budgets for the operation and capital expenses of state transportation agencies and programs.

The 2013-15 State Transportation Appropriations Act (Transportation Budget) appropriated \$8.7 billion from a combination of accounts
