1 AN ACT Relating to Yakima river basin water resource management;
2 amending RCW 90.38.005, 90.38.010, 90.38.900, and 90.38.902; reenacting
3 and amending RCW 43.84.092 and 43.84.092; adding new sections to
4 chapter 90.38 RCW; providing a contingent effective date; providing an
5 expiration date; and providing a contingent expiration date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 **Sec. 1.** RCW 90.38.005 and 1989 c 429 s 1 are each amended to read
8 as follows:

9 (1) The legislature finds that:

10 (a) Under present physical conditions in the Yakima river basin
11 there is an insufficient supply of ground and surface water to satisfy
12 the present needs of the basin, and that the general health, welfare,
13 and safety of the people of the Yakima river basin depend upon the
14 conservation, management, development, and optimum use of all the
15 basin's water resources;

16 (b) (~~Pursuant to P.L. 96-162,~~) The future competition for water
17 among municipal, domestic, industrial, agricultural, and instream water
18 interests in the Yakima river basin will be intensified by continued
19 population growth, and by changes in climate and precipitation

1 anticipated to reduce the basin's snow pack and thereby reduce the
2 total water supply available to existing water users, instream flows,
3 and carryover storage;

4 (c) To address the challenges described in this subsection,
5 congress has enacted several bills to promote Yakima river basin water
6 enhancement, each of which was urged for enactment by this state, the
7 United States ((is now conducting)) has completed a study of ways to
8 provide needed waters through improvements of the federal water project
9 presently existing in the Yakima river basin, and federal, tribal,
10 state, and local cooperators have developed an integrated water
11 resource management plan for improving water supply, habitat, and
12 stream flow conditions in the Yakima river basin;

13 (d) As part of the Yakima river basin water enhancement project,
14 the United States department of the interior's bureau of reclamation is
15 now seeking funding to support implementation of the integrated water
16 resource management plan for the Yakima river basin, which was jointly
17 prepared by the Washington state department of ecology and the United
18 States bureau of reclamation and published in a final programmatic
19 environmental impact statement in March 2012;

20 ((+e)) (e) The interests of the state will be served by developing
21 programs, in cooperation with the United States and the various water
22 users in the basin, that increase the overall ability to manage basin
23 waters in order to better satisfy both present and future needs for
24 water in the Yakima river basin; and

25 (f) The interests of the state will also be served through
26 coordination of federal and state policies and procedures in order to
27 develop and implement projects within the framework of the integrated
28 water resource management plan for the Yakima river basin. The pace of
29 integrated plan implementation over the long term depends upon adequate
30 funding and is subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for
31 this purpose.

32 (2) It is the purpose of this chapter, consistent with these
33 findings, to:

34 (a) Improve the ability of the state to work with the United States
35 and various water users of the Yakima river basin in a program designed
36 to satisfy both existing rights, and other presently unmet as well as
37 future needs of the basin; and

1 (b) Establish legislative intent to promote timely and effective
2 implementation of the integrated plan in the Yakima river basin, and to
3 promote the aggressive pursuit of water supply solutions that provide
4 concurrent benefits to both instream and out-of-stream uses in the
5 Yakima river basin as rapidly as possible.

6 (3) The provisions of this chapter apply only to waters of the
7 Yakima river basin.

8 **Sec. 2.** RCW 90.38.010 and 1989 c 429 s 2 are each amended to read
9 as follows:

10 (~~Unless the context clearly requires otherwise,~~) The definitions
11 in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context
12 clearly requires otherwise.

13 (1) "Department" means the department of ecology.

14 (2) "Integrated plan" means the Yakima river basin integrated water
15 resource management plan developed through a consensus-based approach
16 by a diverse work group of representatives of the Yakama Nation,
17 federal, state, county, and city governments, environmental
18 organizations, and irrigation districts and for which the final
19 programmatic environmental impact statement was made available for
20 review through public notice published in the federal register (77 FR
21 12076 (2012)).

22 (3) "Net water savings" means the amount of water that through
23 hydrological analysis is determined to be conserved and usable for
24 other purposes without impairing existing water rights, reducing the
25 ability to deliver water, or reducing the supply of water that
26 otherwise would have been available to other water users.

27 (~~(+3)~~) (4) "Trust water right" means that portion of an existing
28 water right, constituting net water savings, that is no longer required
29 to be diverted for beneficial use due to the installation of a water
30 conservation project that improves an existing system. The term "trust
31 water right" also applies to any other water right acquired by the
32 department under this chapter for management in the Yakima river basin
33 trust water rights program.

34 (~~(+4)~~) (5) "Water conservation project" means any project funded
35 to further the purposes of this chapter and that achieves physical or
36 operational improvements of efficiency in existing systems for

1 diversion, conveyance, or application of water under existing water
2 rights.

3 (6) "Yakima river basin water enhancement project" means a series
4 of congressional enactments, originally initiated by the United States
5 congress in 1979 under P.L. 96-162, with subsequent federal
6 implementing legislation being passed in 1984 under section 109 of P.L.
7 98-381 to promote fish passage improvements, and in 1994 under P.L.
8 103-434, as amended by P.L. 105-62 in 1997 and P.L. 106-372 in 2000, to
9 promote water conservation, water supply, habitat, and stream
10 enhancement improvements in the Yakima river basin.

11 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 90.38 RCW
12 to read as follows:

13 The department is authorized to implement the integrated water
14 resource management plan in the Yakima river basin, through a
15 coordinated effort of affected federal, state, and local agencies and
16 resources, to develop water supply solutions that provide concurrent
17 benefits to both instream and out-of-stream uses, and to address a
18 variety of water resource and ecosystem problems affecting fish
19 passage, habitat functions, and agricultural, municipal, and domestic
20 water supply in the Yakima river basin, consistent with the integrated
21 plan.

22 (1) Authorized department actions include, but are not limited to:

23 (a) Accepting funds from any entity, public or private, as
24 necessary to implement the objectives of this chapter;

25 (b) Assessing, planning, and developing projects under the Yakima
26 river basin integrated water resource management plan, or for any other
27 action designed to provide access to new water supplies within the
28 Yakima river basin, consistent with the integrated plan and including
29 but not limited to: Enhanced water conservation and efficiency
30 measures, water reallocation markets, in-basin surface and groundwater
31 storage facilities, fish passage at existing in-basin reservoirs,
32 structural and operational modifications to existing facilities,
33 habitat protection and restoration, and general watershed enhancements
34 as necessary to implement the objectives of this chapter and the
35 integrated plan; and

36 (c) Entering into contracts to ensure the effective delivery of

1 water and to provide for the design and construction of facilities
2 necessary to implement the objectives of the integrated plan and this
3 chapter.

4 (2) Consistent with the integrated plan, the goals and objectives
5 of department actions authorized under this chapter include, but are
6 not limited to:

7 (a) Protection, mitigation, and enhancement of fish and wildlife
8 through improved water management; improved instream flows; improved
9 water quality; protection, creation, and enhancement of wetlands;
10 improved fish passage, and by other appropriate means of habitat
11 improvement, including the protection and enhancement of natural
12 wetlands, floodplains, and groundwater storage systems;

13 (b) Improved water availability and reliability, and improved
14 efficiency of water delivery and use, to enhance basin water supplies
15 for agricultural irrigation, municipal, commercial, industrial,
16 domestic, and environmental water uses;

17 (c) Establishment of more efficient water markets and more
18 effective operational and structural changes to manage variability of
19 water supplies and to prepare for the uncertainties of climate change,
20 including but not limited to the facilitation of water banking, water
21 right transfers, dry year options, the voluntary sale and lease of
22 land, water, or water rights from any entity or individual willing to
23 limit or forego water use on a temporary or permanent basis, and any
24 other innovative water allocation tools used to maximize the utility of
25 existing Yakima river basin water supplies, as long as the
26 establishment and use of these tools is consistent with the integrated
27 plan.

28 (3) Water supplies secured through the development of new storage
29 facilities or expansion of existing storage facilities made possible
30 with funding from the Yakima integrated plan implementation account,
31 the Yakima integrated plan implementation taxable bond account, and the
32 Yakima integrated plan implementation revenue recovery account must be
33 allocated for out-of-stream uses and to augment instream flows
34 consistent with the Yakima river basin integrated water resource
35 management plan. Water to be made available to benefit out-of-stream
36 uses under this subsection, but not yet appropriated, must be
37 temporarily available to augment instream flows to the extent that it

1 does not impair existing water rights and is consistent with the
2 integrated plan.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 90.38 RCW
4 to read as follows:

5 (1) The Yakima integrated plan implementation account is created in
6 the state treasury. All receipts from direct appropriations from the
7 legislature, moneys directed to the account pursuant to this chapter,
8 or moneys directed to the account from any other sources must be
9 deposited in the account. The account is intended to fund projects
10 using tax exempt bonds. Moneys in the account may be spent only after
11 appropriation. Expenditures from the account may be used only as
12 provided in this section. Interest earned by deposits in the account
13 will be retained in the account.

14 (2) Expenditures from the account created in this section may be
15 used to assess, plan, and develop projects under the Yakima river basin
16 integrated water resource management plan or for any other actions
17 designed to provide access to new water supplies within the Yakima
18 river basin for both instream and out-of-stream uses, consistent with
19 the integrated plan and the authorities, goals, and objectives set
20 forth in section 3 of this act.

21 (3)(a) Funds may not be expended from the account for the
22 construction of a new storage facility until the department evaluates
23 the following:

24 (i) Water uses to be served by the facility;

25 (ii) The quantity of water necessary to meet the needs of those
26 uses;

27 (iii) The benefits and costs to the state of serving those uses,
28 including short-term and long-term economic, cultural, and
29 environmental effects; and

30 (iv) Alternative means of supplying water to meet those uses,
31 including the costs of those alternatives and an analysis of the extent
32 to which the long-term water supply needs are able to be met using
33 those alternatives.

34 (b) The department may rely on studies and information developed
35 through compliance with other state and federal requirements and other
36 sources. The department shall compile its findings and conclusions and
37 provide a summary of the information it reviewed.

1 (c) Before finalizing its evaluation under the provisions of this
2 subsection, the department shall make the preliminary evaluation
3 available to the public. Public comment may be made to the department
4 within thirty days of the date the preliminary evaluation is made
5 public.

6 (4) For water supplies developed under the integrated plan to
7 support future municipal and domestic water needs, the department shall
8 give preference to other entities in managing water service contracts.
9 Where the department determines that the management of such contracts
10 by other entities is not feasible or suitable, the department may enter
11 into water service contracts with applicants receiving water from the
12 program to recover all or a portion of the cost of developing water
13 supplies made possible with funding from the account created in this
14 section. The department may deny an application if the applicant does
15 not enter into a water service contract. Revenue collected from water
16 service contracts must be deposited into the Yakima integrated plan
17 implementation revenue recovery account created in section 6 of this
18 act. The department may adopt rules describing the methodology as to
19 how charges will be established and direct costs recovered for water
20 supply developed under the Yakima river basin integrated water resource
21 management plan implementation program.

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 90.38 RCW
23 to read as follows:

24 (1) The Yakima integrated plan implementation taxable bond account
25 is created in the state treasury. All receipts from direct
26 appropriations from the legislature, moneys directed to the account
27 pursuant to this chapter, or moneys directed to the account from any
28 other sources must be deposited in the account. The account is
29 intended to fund projects using taxable bonds. Moneys in the account
30 may be spent only after appropriation. Expenditures from the account
31 may be used only as provided in this section. Interest earned by
32 deposits in the account will be retained in the account.

33 (2) Expenditures from the account created in this section may be
34 used to assess, plan, and develop projects under the Yakima river basin
35 integrated water resource management plan or for any other actions
36 designed to provide access to new water supplies within the Yakima

1 river basin for both instream and out-of-stream uses, consistent with
2 the integrated plan and the authorities, goals, and objectives set
3 forth in section 3 of this act.

4 (3)(a) Funds may not be expended from the account for the
5 construction of a new storage facility until the department evaluates
6 the following:

7 (i) Water uses to be served by the facility;

8 (ii) The quantity of water necessary to meet the needs of those
9 uses;

10 (iii) The benefits and costs to the state of serving those uses,
11 including short-term and long-term economic, cultural, and
12 environmental effects; and

13 (iv) Alternative means of supplying water to meet those uses,
14 including the costs of those alternatives and an analysis of the extent
15 to which the long-term water supply needs are able to be met using
16 those alternatives.

17 (b) The department may rely on studies and information developed
18 through compliance with other state and federal requirements and other
19 sources. The department shall compile its findings and conclusions and

31 into water service contracts with applicants receiving water from the
32 program to recover all or a portion of the cost of developing water

34 section. The department may deny an application if the applicant does
35 not enter into a water service contract. Revenue collected from water
36 service contracts must be deposited into the Yakima integrated plan
37 implementation revenue recovery account created in section 6 of this
38 act. The department may adopt rules describing the methodology as to

1 how charges will be established and direct costs recovered for water
2 supply developed under the Yakima river basin integrated water resource
3 management plan implementation program.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** A new section is added to chapter 90.38 RCW
5 to read as follows:

6 (1) The Yakima integrated plan implementation revenue recovery
7 account is created in the state treasury. All receipts from direct
8 appropriations from the legislature, moneys directed to the account
9 pursuant to this chapter, or moneys directed to the account from any
10 other sources must be deposited in the account. The account is
11 intended to fund projects using revenues from water service contracts
12 as authorized in this chapter. Moneys in the account may be spent only
13 after appropriation. Expenditures from the account may be used only as
14 provided in this section. Interest earned by deposits in the account
15 will be retained in the account.

16 (2) Expenditures from the account created in this section may be
17 used to assess, plan, and develop projects under the Yakima river basin
18 integrated water resource management plan or for any other actions
19 designed to provide access to new water supplies within the Yakima
20 river basin for both instream and out-of-stream uses, consistent with
21 the integrated plan and the authorities, goals, and objectives set
22 forth in section 3 of this act.

23 (3)(a) Funds may not be expended from the account for the
24 construction of a new storage facility until the department evaluates
25 the following:

26 (i) Water uses to be served by the facility;

27 (ii) The quantity of water necessary to meet the needs of those
28 uses;

15 applicants receiving water from the program to recover all or a portion
16 of the cost of developing water supplies made possible with funding
17 from the account created in this section. The department may deny an
18 application if the applicant does not enter into a water service
19 contract. Revenue collected from water service contracts must be
20 deposited into the Yakima integrated plan implementation revenue
21 recovery account created in this section. The department may adopt
22 rules describing the methodology as to how charges will be established
23 and direct costs recovered for water supply developed under the Yakima
24 river basin integrated water resource management plan implementation
25 program.

26 **Sec. 7.** RCW 90.38.900 and 1989 c 429 s 7 are each amended to read
27 as follows:

28 The policies and purposes of this chapter shall not be construed as
29 replacing or amending the policies or the purposes for which funds
30 available under chapter 43.83B (~~(04)~~), 43.99E, or 90.90 RCW may be used
31 within or without the Yakima river basin.

32 **Sec. 8.** RCW 90.38.902 and 1989 c 429 s 9 are each amended to read
33 as follows:

34 (1) Nothing in this chapter shall authorize the impairment of, or
35 operate to impair, any existing water rights.

1 (2) Nothing in this chapter may be construed to limit, impair,
2 waive, abrogate, or diminish:

3 (a) Any treaty or other rights of the Yakama Nation;

4 (b) Any powers, rights, or authorities conferred upon irrigation
5 districts under existing law;

6 (c) Any rights or jurisdictions of the United States, the state of
7 Washington, or other person or entity over waters in the Yakima river
8 basin.

9 **NEW SECTION. Sec. 9.** A new section is added to chapter 90.38 RCW
10 to read as follows:

11 (1) By December 1, 2015, and by December 1st of every odd-numbered
12 year thereafter, and in compliance with RCW 43.01.036, the department,
13 in consultation with the United States bureau of reclamation, the
14 Yakama Nation, Yakima river basin local governments, and key basin
15 stakeholders, shall provide a Yakima river basin integrated water
16 resource management plan implementation status report to the
17 legislature and to the governor that includes: A description of
18 measures that have been funded and implemented in the Yakima river
19 basin and their effectiveness in meeting the objectives of this act, a
20 project funding list that represents the state's percentage cost share
21 to implement the integrated plan measures for the current biennium and
22 cost estimates for subsequent biennia, a description of progress toward
23 concurrent realization of the integrated plan's fish passage, watershed
24 enhancement, and water supply goals, and an annual summary of all
25 associated costs to develop and implement projects within the framework
26 of the integrated water resource management plan for the Yakima river
27 basin.

28 (2) This section expires December 31, 2045.

29 **Sec. 10.** RCW 43.84.092 and 2012 c 198 s 2, 2012 c 196 s 7, 2012 c
30 187 s 14, and 2012 c 83 s 4 are each reenacted and amended to read as
31 follows:

32 (1) All earnings of investments of surplus balances in the state
33 treasury shall be deposited to the treasury income account, which
34 account is hereby established in the state treasury.

35 (2) The treasury income account shall be utilized to pay or receive
36 funds associated with federal programs as required by the federal cash

1 management improvement act of 1990. The treasury income account is
2 subject in all respects to chapter 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is
3 required for refunds or allocations of interest earnings required by
4 the cash management improvement act. Refunds of interest to the
5 federal treasury required under the cash management improvement act
6 fall under RCW 43.88.180 and shall not require appropriation. The
7 office of financial management shall determine the amounts due to or
8 from the federal government pursuant to the cash management improvement
9 act. The office of financial management may direct transfers of funds
10 between accounts as deemed necessary to implement the provisions of the
11 cash management improvement act, and this subsection. Refunds or
12 allocations shall occur prior to the distributions of earnings set
13 forth in subsection (4) of this section.

14 (3) Except for the provisions of RCW 43.84.160, the treasury income
15 account may be utilized for the payment of purchased banking services
16 on behalf of treasury funds including, but not limited to, depository,
17 safekeeping, and disbursement functions for the state treasury and
18 affected state agencies. The treasury income account is subject in all
19 respects to chapter 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is required for
20 payments to financial institutions. Payments shall occur prior to
21 distribution of earnings set forth in subsection (4) of this section.

22 (4) Monthly, the state treasurer shall distribute the earnings
23 credited to the treasury income account. The state treasurer shall
24 credit the general fund with all the earnings credited to the treasury
25 income account except:

26 (a) The following accounts and funds shall receive their
27 proportionate share of earnings based upon each account's and fund's
28 average daily balance for the period: The aeronautics account, the
29 aircraft search and rescue account, the Alaskan Way viaduct replacement
30 project account, the budget stabilization account, the capital vessel
31 replacement account, the capitol building construction account, the
32 Cedar River channel construction and operation account, the Central
33 Washington University capital projects account, the charitable,
34 educational, penal and reformatory institutions account, the cleanup
35 settlement account, the Columbia river basin water supply development
36 account, the Columbia river basin taxable bond water supply development
37 account, the Columbia river basin water supply revenue recovery
38 account, the common school construction fund, the county arterial

1 preservation account, the county criminal justice assistance account,
2 the deferred compensation administrative account, the deferred
3 compensation principal account, the department of licensing services
4 account, the department of retirement systems expense account, the
5 developmental disabilities community trust account, the drinking water
6 assistance account, the drinking water assistance administrative
7 account, the drinking water assistance repayment account, the Eastern
8 Washington University capital projects account, the Interstate 405
9 express toll lanes operations account, the education construction fund,
10 the education legacy trust account, the election account, the energy
11 freedom account, the energy recovery act account, the essential rail
12 assistance account, The Evergreen State College capital projects
13 account, the federal forest revolving account, the ferry bond
14 retirement fund, the freight congestion relief account, the freight
