- 1 AN ACT Relating to the creation of a special license plate
- 2 dedicated to raising revenue to fund preventative wolf management
- 3 efforts at the department of fish and wildlife; amending RCW 46.18.200,
- 4 46.17.220, 46.68.425, and 46.18.060; reenacting and amending RCW
- 5 77.12.170; and adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 7 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2012 c 65 s 1 are each amended to read 8 as follows:
- 9 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the 10 department:
- 11 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized license 12 plates for vehicles required to display one and two license plates
- 13 unless otherwise specified;
- 14 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the 15 department;
- 16 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter 46.87
  17 RCW; and
- 18 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

9		to include army, navy, air force, marine corps, coast guard,
10		and national guard.
11	Endangered wildlife	Displays a symbol or artwork, approved by the special
12		license plate review board and the legislature.
13	Gonzaga University alumni association	Recognizes the Gonzaga University alumni association.
14	Helping kids speak	Recognizes an organization that supports programs that
15		provide no-cost speech pathology programs to children.
16	Keep kids safe	Recognizes efforts to prevent child abuse and neglect.
17	Law enforcement memorial	Honors law enforcement officers in Washington killed in
18		the line of duty.
19	Music matters	Displays the "Music Matters" logo.
20	Professional firefighters and paramedics	Recognizes professional firefighters and paramedics who
21		are members of the Washington state council of
22		firefighters.
23	Share the road	Recognizes an organization that promotes bicycle safety
24		and awareness education.
25	Ski & ride Washington	Recognizes the Washington snowsports industry.
26	State flower	Recognizes the Washington state flower.

(3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters and paramedics special license plates must show proof eligibility by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington state council of firefighters.

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- (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate fire If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting service service. before ten years of service have been completed, the volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves, the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their personal vehicles. volunteer firefighter is convicted of a violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be surrendered upon conviction.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW to read as follows:

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"Washington's wolves license plates" means special license plates issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display a symbol or artwork of a wolf.

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Sec. 3. RCW 46.17.220 and 2012 c 65 s 4 are each amended to read as follows:

(1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special license plate fee as listed in this section.

- (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer shall credit the funds to the state general fund.
- **Sec. 4.** RCW 46.68.425 and 2011 c 171 s 88 are each amended to read 20 as follows:
- 21 (1) The department shall:
- 22 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW 23 46.17.220;
  - (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and collection expenses incurred by it; and
  - (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.
  - (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor vehicle fund until the department determines that the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special license plate fees to the following accounts by special license plate type:

- **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.18.060 and 2012 c 65 s 6 are each amended to read 20 as follows:
  - (1) The department must review and either approve or reject special license plate applications submitted by sponsoring organizations.
  - (2) Duties of the department include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - (a) Review and approve the annual financial reports submitted by sponsoring organizations with active special license plate series and present those annual financial reports to the joint transportation committee;
  - (b) Report annually to the joint transportation committee on the special license plate applications that were considered by the department;
  - (c) Issue approval and rejection notification letters to sponsoring organizations, the executive committee of the joint transportation committee, and the legislative sponsors identified in each application. The letters must be issued within seven days of making a determination on the status of an application; and

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(d) Review annually the number of plates sold for each special license plate series created after January 1, 2003. The department may submit a recommendation to discontinue a special plate series to the executive committee of the joint transportation committee.

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- (3) Except as provided in RCW 46.18.245, in order to assess the effects and impact of the proliferation of special license plates, the legislature declares a temporary moratorium on the issuance of any additional plates until July 1, 2013. During this period of time, the department is prohibited from accepting, reviewing, processing, or approving any applications. Additionally, a special license plate may not be enacted by the legislature during the moratorium, unless the proposed license plate has been approved by the former special license plate review board before February 15, 2005.
- 14 (4) The limitations under subsection (3) of this section do not 15 apply to the following special license plates:
  - (a) 4-H license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;
  - (b) Music Matters license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;
- 18 (c) State flower license plates created under RCW 46.18.200;
- 19 (d) Volunteer firefighter license plates created under RCW 20 46.18.200;
- 21 (e) Washington's wolves license plates created under RCW 46.18.200.
- 22 **Sec. 6.** RCW 77.12.170 and 2011 c 339 s 3, 2011 c 320 s 23, and 23 2011 c 171 s 112 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
  - (1) There is established in the state treasury the state wildlife account which consists of moneys received from:
    - (a) Rentals or concessions of the department;
  - (b) The sale of real or personal property held for department purposes, unless the property is seized or recovered through a fish, shellfish, or wildlife enforcement action;
    - (c) The assessment of administrative penalties;
- 31 (d) The sale of licenses, permits, tags, and stamps required by 32 chapter 77.32 RCW, RCW 77.65.490, and application fees;
  - (e) Fees for informational materials published by the department;
- (f) Fees for personalized vehicle, Wild on Washington, ((and))

  Endangered Wildlife, and Washington's wolves license plates and

  Washington's Wildlife license plate collection as provided in chapter

  46.17 RCW;

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- 1 (g) Articles or wildlife sold by the director under this title;
- (h) Compensation for damage to department property or wildlife losses or contributions, gifts, or grants received under RCW 77.12.320.

  However, this excludes fish and shellfish overages, and court-ordered restitution or donations associated with any fish, shellfish, or wildlife enforcement action, as such moneys must be deposited pursuant to RCW 77.15.425;
- 8 (i) Excise tax on anadromous game fish collected under chapter 9 82.27 RCW;
- 10 (j) The department's share of revenues from auctions and raffles authorized by the commission;
- 12 (k) The sale of watchable wildlife decals under RCW 77.32.560; ((and))
  - (1) Moneys received from the recreation access pass account created in RCW 79A.80.090 must be dedicated to stewardship, operations, and maintenance of department lands used for public recreation purposes; and
    - (m) Donations received by the director under RCW 77.12.039.
- 19 (2) State and county officers receiving any moneys listed in 20 subsection (1) of this section shall deposit them in the state treasury 21 to be credited to the state wildlife account.

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
