- 11 follows:
- Section 2 of this act expires $((\frac{\text{July}}{\text{January}}))$ January 1, $((\frac{2015}{\text{January}}))$ 2014.
- 13 NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. The department of social and health services
- 14 shall consult with stakeholders and legislative staff to ensure that
- 15 moneys appropriated for this legislation are spent in a way that
- 16 increases involuntary commitment capacity consistent with the findings
