- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 9A.56.360 and 2006 c 277 s 3 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (1) A person commits retail theft with ((extenuating)) special 8 circumstances if he or she commits theft of property from a mercantile 9 establishment with one of the following ((extenuating)) special 10 circumstances:
- 11 (a) To facilitate the theft, the person leaves the mercantile 12 establishment through a designated emergency exit;
 - (b) The person was, at the time of the theft, in possession of an item, article, implement, or device designed to overcome security systems including, but not limited to, lined bags or tag removers; or
- 16 (c) The person committed theft at three or more separate and 17 distinct mercantile establishments within a one hundred eighty-day 18 period.

(2) A person is guilty of retail theft with ((extenuating)) special circumstances in the first degree if the theft involved constitutes theft in the first degree. Retail theft with ((extenuating)) special circumstances in the first degree is a class B felony.

- (3) A person is guilty of retail theft with ((extenuating)) special circumstances in the second degree if the theft involved constitutes theft in the second degree. Retail theft with ((extenuating)) special circumstances in the second degree is a class C felony.
- 9 (4) A person is guilty of retail theft with ((extenuating)) special 10 circumstances in the third degree if the theft involved constitutes 11 theft in the third degree. Retail theft with ((extenuating)) special 12 circumstances in the third degree is a class C felony.
- 13 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** This act takes effect January 1, 2014.
