- 1 AN ACT Relating to including information on home energy efficiency
- 2 in residential home inspection reports; amending RCW 18.280.030; and
- 3 creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that the state's
- 6 consumers and real estate industry recognize the benefits of home
- 7 energy efficiency. The legislature also finds that home inspections
- 8 occur in a majority of residential real estate transactions, and that
- 9 the state has recently adopted a comprehensive system of educating and
- 10 licensing home inspectors. It is therefore the intent of the
- 11 legislature to ensure that residential home inspections provide
- 12 consumers with information about home energy efficiency based on
- 13 standards developed by the home inspector advisory licensing board.
- 14 Sec. 2. RCW 18.280.030 and 2008 c 119 s 3 are each amended to read
- 15 as follows:
- 16 A person licensed under this chapter is responsible for performing
- 17 a visual and noninvasive inspection of the following readily accessible
- 18 systems and components of a home and reporting on the general condition

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of those systems and components at the time of the inspection in his or 1 2 her written report: The roof, foundation, exterior, heating system, air-conditioning system, structure, plumbing and electrical systems, 3 4 and other aspects of the home as may be identified by the board. inspection must include looking for certain fire and safety hazards as 5 6 defined by the board. The written report must include information describing those systems and components of homes that affect energy 7 efficiency, consistent with the standards of practice developed by the 8 board. The standards of practice to be developed by the board will be 9 used as the minimum standards for an inspection. The duties of the 10 11 home inspector with regard to wood destroying organisms are provided in 12 RCW 18.280.190.

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
