- AN ACT Relating to safe school buildings; amending RCW 28A.335.010;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 28A.320 RCW; and adding a new section
- 3 to chapter 28A.300 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.320 6 RCW to read as follows:
 - By December 1, 2014, a school district shall either:
- 8 (1) Work with its local law enforcement agency to develop and 9 implement a panic alarm system using technology to expedite law 10 enforcement's arrival and effective response in the event of a threat
- 11 at a school; or

- 12 (2) Implement a model policy developed by the superintendent of
- 13 public instruction that the school district may use to implement a
- 14 panic alarm system that uses technology to expedite law enforcement's
- 15 arrival and effective response in the event of a threat at a school.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
- 17 RCW to read as follows:
- 18 (1) The superintendent of public instruction shall collaborate with

- 1 law enforcement to develop a model policy that school districts may use
- 2 to implement a panic alarm system that uses technology to expedite law
- 3 enforcement's arrival and effective response in the event of a threat
- 4 at a school.
- 5 (2) The superintendent of public instruction shall develop and make 6 the model policy available to school districts by June 1, 2014.
- 7 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28A.335.010 and 1969 ex.s. c 223 s 28A.58.102 are each 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 <u>(1)</u> Every board of directors, unless otherwise specifically 10 provided by law, shall:
- 11 $((\frac{1}{1}))$ (a) Cause all school buildings to be properly heated,
- 12 lighted, and ventilated and maintained in a clean and sanitary
- 13 condition; ((and
- 14 (2))) (b) Maintain and repair, furnish, and insure such school buildings;
- 16 <u>(c) Strongly consider installing a perimeter security control</u>
 17 mechanism or system on all school campuses, as is appropriate to the
- 18 design of each campus; and
- 19 <u>(d) Give preference to all school building plans and designs for</u> 20 new school construction or remodeling that promote:
- 21 <u>(i) The highest level of safety and security in the event of a</u> 22 threat during school hours;
- 23 <u>(ii) Direct control and observation of the public entering school</u> 24 grounds;
- 25 (iii) The public entering school grounds through as few entrances
- 26 <u>as possible, such as through the main entrance of a school's</u>
- 27 <u>administrative offices; and</u>
- 28 <u>(iv) The creation of one or more mantraps by which a potential</u> 29 threat may be isolated from the rest of the school campus.
- 30 (2) Specific school designs and construction started before the
- 31 <u>effective date of this section are not subject to the requirements of</u>
- 32 <u>subsection (1)(c) and (d) of this section.</u>
- 33 (3) For the purposes of this section, "mantrap" means a space 34 designed and constructed to entrap a human.
