1 AN ACT Relating to modifying the transportation system policy goal 2 of mobility; and amending RCW 47.04.280.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 47.04.280 and 2013 c 199 s 1 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) It is the intent of the legislature to establish policy goals 7 for the planning, operation, performance of, and investment in, the 8 state's transportation system. The policy goals established under this 9 section are deemed consistent with the benchmark categories adopted by 10 the state's blue ribbon commission on transportation on November 30, 11 2000. Public investments in transportation should support achievement 12 of these policy goals:

13 (a) Economic vitality: To promote and develop transportation 14 systems that stimulate, support, and enhance the movement of people and 15 goods to ensure a prosperous economy;

(b) Preservation: To maintain, preserve, and extend the life and
 utility of prior investments in transportation systems and services;

(c) Safety: To provide for and improve the safety and security oftransportation customers and the transportation system;

(d) Mobility: To improve the predictable movement of goods and
 people throughout Washington state, including congestion relief and
 improved freight mobility;

4 (e) Environment: To enhance Washington's quality of life through
5 transportation investments that promote energy conservation, enhance
6 healthy communities, and protect the environment; and

7 (f) Stewardship: To continuously improve the quality,
8 effectiveness, and efficiency of the transportation system.

9 (2) The powers, duties, and functions of state transportation 10 agencies must be performed in a manner consistent with the policy goals 11 set forth in subsection (1) of this section.

12 (3) These policy goals are intended to be the basis for 13 establishing detailed and measurable objectives and related performance 14 measures.

15 (4) It is the intent of the legislature that the office of financial management establish objectives and performance measures for 16 17 the department of transportation and other state agencies with 18 transportation-related responsibilities to ensure transportation system 19 performance at local, regional, and state government levels progresses 20 toward the attainment of the policy goals set forth in subsection (1) 21 of this section. The office of financial management shall submit 22 initial objectives and performance measures to the legislature for its 23 review and shall provide copies of the same to the commission during 24 the 2008 legislative session. The office of financial management shall 25 submit objectives and performance measures to the legislature for its 26 review and shall provide copies of the same to the commission during 27 each regular session of the legislature during an even-numbered year 28 thereafter.

(5) A local or regional agency engaging in transportation planning 29 30 may voluntarily establish objectives and performance measures to demonstrate progress toward the attainment of the policy goals set 31 32 forth in subsection (1) of this section or any other transportation policy goals established by the local or regional agency. A local or 33 regional agency engaging in transportation planning is encouraged to 34 35 provide local and regional objectives and performance measures to be 36 included with the objectives and performance measures submitted to the

- 2 (6) This section does not create a private right of action.

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
