1 AN ACT Relating to school library information and technology 2 programs; and amending RCW 28A.320.240.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.320.240 and 2006 c 263 s 914 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (1) The purpose of this section is to identify quality criteria for 7 school library ((media)) <u>information and technology</u> programs that 8 support the student learning goals under RCW 28A.150.210, the essential 9 academic learning requirements under RCW 28A.655.070, and high school 10 graduation requirements adopted under RCW 28A.230.090.

(2) Every board of directors shall provide <u>resources and materials</u> for the operation ((and stocking of such libraries)) of school library and information technology programs as the board deems necessary for the proper education of the district's students <u>as provided in the</u> <u>prototypical school model under RCW 28A.150.260</u> or as otherwise required by law or rule of the superintendent of public instruction.

17 (3) "Teacher-librarian" means a ((certified)) certificated teacher 18 with a library media endorsement under rules adopted by the 19 professional educator standards board.

1 "School((-))library ((media)) information and technology (4) 2 program" means a school-based program that is staffed by a certificated teacher-librarian and provides a variety of resources that support 3 4 student mastery of the essential academic learning requirements in all subject areas and the implementation of the district's school 5 6 improvement plan. The school library information and technology program provides a broad, flexible array of services, resources, 7 instruction, and supports within the context of all current educational 8 standards adopted by the office of the superintendent of public 9 10 instruction.

11 (5) The teacher-librarian, through the school-library media 12 program, shall collaborate as an instructional partner to help all 13 students meet the content goals in all subject areas, and assist high 14 school students completing the culminating project and high school and 15 beyond plans required for graduation.

16 (6) The teacher-librarian shall collaborate with his or her schools
17 to:

18 (a) Integrate information and technology into curriculum and 19 instruction, including but not limited to instructing other 20 certificated staff about using and integrating information and 21 technology literacy into instruction through workshops, modeling 22 lessons, and individual peer coaching;

(b) Provide information management instruction to students and staff about how to effectively use emerging learning technologies for school and lifelong learning, as well as in the appropriate use of computers and mobile devices in an educational setting;

27 (c) Help teachers and students efficiently and effectively access
28 the highest quality information available while using information
29 ethically;

## 30 (d) Instruct students in digital citizenship including how to be 31 critical consumers of information and provide guidance about thoughtful 32 and strategic use of online resources; and

33 (e) Create a culture of reading in the school community by 34 developing a diverse, student-focused collection of materials that 35 ensures all students can find something of quality to read and by 36 facilitating school-wide reading initiatives along with providing 1 individual support and guidance for students.

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
