1 AN ACT Relating to heavy haul corridors; amending RCW 46.44.0915; 2 providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.44.0915 and 2012 c 86 s 804 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

(1)(a) Except as provided in (b) of this subsection, the department 6 7 of transportation, with respect to state highways maintained within 8 port district property, may, at the request of a port commission, make 9 and into agreements with port districts adjacent enter and 10 jurisdictions or agencies of the districts, for the purpose of identifying, managing, and maintaining short heavy haul industrial 11 corridors within port district property for the movement of overweight 12 13 sealed containers used in international trade.

(b) The department of transportation shall designate that portion of state route number 97 from the Canadian border to milepost 331.12 as a heavy haul industrial corridor for the movement of overweight vehicles to and from the Oroville railhead. The department may issue special permits to vehicles operating in the heavy haul industrial corridor to carry weight in excess of weight limits established in RCW
46.44.041, but not to exceed a gross vehicle weight of 139,994 pounds.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (1)(b) of this section, the 3 department may issue special permits to vehicles operating in a heavy 4 haul industrial corridor to carry weight in excess of weight limits 5 established in RCW 46.44.041. However, the excess weight on a single 6 7 axle, tandem axle, or any axle group must not exceed that allowed by RCW 46.44.091 (1) and (2), weight per tire must not exceed six hundred 8 pounds per inch width of tire, and gross vehicle weight must not exceed 9 10 one hundred five thousand five hundred pounds.

(3) The entity operating or hiring vehicles under subsection (1)(b) 11 12 of this section or moving overweight sealed containers used in international trade must pay a fee for each special permit of one 13 14 hundred dollars per month or one thousand dollars annually, beginning from the date of issue, for all movements under the special permit made 15 on state highways within a heavy haul industrial corridor. 16 Within a 17 port district property, under no circumstances are the for hire carriers or rail customers responsible for the purchase or cost of the 18 permits. All funds collected, except the amount retained by authorized 19 agents of the department under RCW 46.44.096, must be forwarded to the 20 21 state treasurer and deposited in the motor vehicle fund.

(4) For purposes of this section, an overweight sealed container used in international trade, including its contents, is considered nondivisible when transported within a heavy haul industrial corridor defined by the department.

(5) Any agreement entered into by the department as authorized 26 27 under this section with a port district adjacent to Puget Sound and located within a county that has a population of more than seven 28 hundred thousand, but less than one million, must 29 limit the applicability of any established heavy haul corridor to that portion of 30 state route no. 509 beginning at milepost 0.25 in the vicinity of East 31 32 'D' Street and ending at milepost ((3.88)) <u>5.7</u> in the vicinity of Norpoint Way Northeast. ((For - the - 2011-2013 - fiscal 33 ((<del>Taylor</del>)) biennium, the limit for any established heavy haul corridor established 34 pursuant to this subsection (5) must be within that portion of state 35 36 route number 509 beginning at milepost 0.25 in the vicinity of East 'D' 37 Street-and-ending-at-milepost-5.7-in-the-vicinity-of-Norpoint-Way 38 Northeast.))

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(6) The department of transportation may adopt reasonable rules to
implement this section.

3 <u>NEW\_SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 4 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 5 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 6 July 1, 2013.
