- 1 AN ACT Relating to the practice of midwifery; amending RCW
- 2 18.50.010, 18.50.065, and 18.50.102; and adding a new section to
- 3 chapter 18.50 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.50.010 and 1991 c 3 s 103 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 Any person shall be regarded as practicing midwifery within the
- 8 meaning of this chapter who shall render medical aid for a fee or
- 9 compensation to a woman during prenatal, intrapartum, and postpartum
- 10 stages or to her newborn up to two weeks of age or who shall advertise
- 11 as a midwife by signs, printed cards, or otherwise. Nothing shall be
- 12 construed in this chapter to prohibit gratuitous services. It shall be
- 13 the duty of a midwife to consult with a physician whenever there are
- 14 significant deviations from normal in either the mother or the
- 15 ((infant)) newborn.
- 16 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.50.065 and 1991 c 332 s 32 are each amended to read
- 17 as follows:
- 18 (1) An applicant holding a credential in another state may be

- credentialed to practice in this state without examination if the secretary determines that the other state's credentialing standards are substantially equivalent to the standards in this state.
- 4 (2) The secretary shall write rules to bridge the gap between 5 requirements of national certification of certified professional 6 midwives and state requirements for licensure for licensed midwives.
- 7 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.50.102 and 1996 c 191 s 25 are each amended to read 8 as follows:
- 9 ((Every person licensed to practice midwifery shall register with 10 the secretary and pay a renewal fee)) (1) A licensed midwife must renew 11 his or her license according to the following requirements:
- 12 <u>(a) Completion of a minimum of thirty hours of continuing</u>
 13 education, approved by the secretary, every three years;
- 14 <u>(b) Proof of participation in a Washington state coordinated</u>
 15 <u>quality improvement program as detailed in rule;</u>
- 16 <u>(c) Proof of participation in data submission on perinatal outcomes</u>
 17 to a national or state research organization, as detailed in rule; and
- 18 <u>(d) Fees</u> determined by the secretary as provided in RCW 43.70.250 and 43.70.280.
- 20 <u>(2) The secretary shall write rules regarding the renewal</u>
 21 <u>requirements and the department's process for verification of the</u>
 22 third-party data submission.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 18.50 RCW to read as follows:
- A licensed midwife may delegate to a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse selected acts, tasks, or procedures that constitute the practice of midwifery but do not exceed the education of the nurse.
