1 AN ACT Relating to income eligibility for temporary assistance for 2 needy families benefits for a child; and amending RCW 74.12.037.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 74.12.037 and 2011 1st sp.s. c 42 s 4 are each amended 5 to read as follows:

(1) The department shall adopt rules((--effective-November-1,6 7 2011,)) establishing income eligibility for temporary assistance for needy families benefits for a child, other than a foster child, who 8 9 lives with a caregiver other than his or her parents. The department 10 shall establish a sliding scale benefit standard for a child when the income of the child's caregiver is above two hundred percent but below 11 three hundred percent of the federal poverty level based on family 12 A caregiver with an income above three hundred percent of the 13 size. federal poverty level shall not be eligible for temporary assistance 14 15 for needy families benefits for a child, not a foster child, who is residing with that caregiver. 16

17 (2)(a) For purposes of this section, the department may, by rule,
18 exempt fifty percent of a caregiver's unearned income in determining

- 1 <u>eligibility and benefit standards</u>. This is in addition to other
- 2 <u>exemptions authorized by law.</u>
- 3 (b) For purposes of this subsection, "unearned income" means income
- 4 received from a source other than employment or self-employment.
