1 AN ACT Relating to providing an exemption from continuing 2 competency requirements for registered nurses who seek advanced nursing 3 degrees; and amending RCW 18.79.110.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.79.110 and 1994 sp.s. c 9 s 411 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 (1) The commission shall keep a record of all of its proceedings 8 and make such reports to the governor as may be required. The commission shall define by rules what constitutes specialized and 9 10 advanced levels of nursing practice as recognized by the medical and nursing profession. The commission may adopt rules or issue advisory 11 12 opinions in response to questions put to it by professional health 13 associations, nursing practitioners, and consumers in this state 14 concerning the authority of various categories of nursing practitioners 15 to perform particular acts.

16 (2) The commission shall approve curricula and shall establish 17 criteria for minimum standards for schools preparing persons for 18 licensing as registered nurses, advanced registered nurse 19 practitioners, and licensed practical nurses under this chapter. The

commission shall approve such schools of nursing as meet the 1 2 requirements of this chapter and the commission, and the commission shall approve establishment of basic nursing education programs and 3 shall establish criteria as to the need for and the size of a program 4 5 and the type of program and the geographical location. The commission shall establish criteria for proof of reasonable currency of knowledge б 7 and skill as a basis for safe practice after three years' inactive or lapsed status. The commission shall establish criteria for licensing 8 The commission shall determine examination 9 bv endorsement. requirements for applicants for licensing as registered nurses, 10 11 advanced registered nurse practitioners, and licensed practical nurses 12 under this chapter, and shall certify to the secretary for licensing 13 duly qualified applicants.

14 (3) The commission shall adopt rules on continuing competency. The 15 rules must include exemptions from the continuing competency 16 requirements for registered nurses seeking advanced nursing degrees. 17 Nothing in this subsection prohibits the commission from providing 18 additional exemptions for any person credentialed under this chapter 19 who is enrolled in an advanced education program.

20 (4) The commission shall adopt such rules under chapter 34.05 RCW 21 as are necessary to fulfill the purposes of this chapter.

22 (5) The commission is the successor in interest of the board of the board of practical nursing. All contracts, 23 nursing and 24 undertakings, agreements, rules, regulations, decisions, orders, and 25 policies of the former board of nursing or the board of practical nursing continue in full force and effect under the commission until 26 27 the commission amends or rescinds those rules, regulations, decisions, orders, or policies. 28

29 <u>(6)</u> The members of the commission are immune from suit in an 30 action, civil or criminal, based on its disciplinary proceedings or 31 other official acts performed in good faith as members of the 32 commission.

33 (7) Whenever the workload of the commission requires, the 34 commission may request that the secretary appoint pro tempore members 35 of the commission. When serving, pro tempore members of the commission 36 have all of the powers, duties, and immunities, and are entitled to all

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- 1 of the emoluments, including travel expenses, of regularly appointed
- 2 members of the commission.
