1 On page 6, beginning on line 21, strike all of subsection (1) 2. 3 Renumber the remaining subsections consecutively and correct any internal references accordingly. 5 6 On page 60, after line 3, insert the following: 7 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 607. Funds appropriated in this act may not be 8 used to install, maintain, or operate automated traffic safety cameras 9 used to detect the failure of a vehicle to stop when facing a steady 10 red traffic control signal." 11 12 On page 65, beginning on line 10, strike all of section 704 and 13 insert the following: 14 "Sec. 704. RCW 46.63.170 and 2013 c 306 s 711 are each amended to 15 read as follows: 16 (1) The use of automated traffic safety cameras for issuance of 17 notices of infraction is subject to the following requirements: 18 (a) The appropriate local legislative authority must prepare an 19 analysis of the locations within the jurisdiction where automated 20 traffic safety cameras are proposed to be located: (i) Before 21 enacting an ordinance allowing for the initial use of automated 22 traffic safety cameras; and (ii) before adding additional cameras or 23 relocating any existing camera to a new location within the 24 jurisdiction. Automated traffic safety cameras may be used to detect 25 one or more of the following: Stoplight, except during the 2015-2017 26 fiscal biennium; railroad crossing( $(\tau)$ ); or school speed zone 27 violations. At a minimum, the local ordinance must contain the

- 1 restrictions described in this section and provisions for public
- 2 notice and signage. Cities and counties using automated traffic
- 3 safety cameras before July 24, 2005, are subject to the restrictions
- 4 described in this section, but are not required to enact an
- 5 authorizing ordinance. Beginning one year after June 7, 2012, cities
- 6 and counties using automated traffic safety cameras must post an
- 7 annual report of the number of traffic accidents that occurred at
- 8 each location where an automated traffic safety camera is located as
- 9 well as the number of notices of infraction issued for each camera
- 10 and any other relevant information about the automated traffic
- 11 safety cameras that the city or county deems appropriate on the
- 12 city's or county's web site.
- 13 (b) Use of automated traffic safety cameras is restricted to the
- 14 following locations only: (i) Except during the 2015-2017 fiscal
- 15 biennium, intersections of two arterials with traffic control
- 16 signals that have yellow change interval durations in accordance
- 17 with RCW 47.36.022, which interval durations may not be reduced
- 18 after placement of the camera; (ii) railroad crossings; and (iii)
- 19 school speed zones.
- 20 (c) During the 2011-2013 and 2013-2015 fiscal biennia, automated
- 21 traffic safety cameras may be used to detect speed violations for
- 22 the purposes of section 201(2), chapter 367, Laws of 2011 and
- 23 section 201(4), chapter 306, Laws of 2013 if the local legislative
- 24 authority first enacts an ordinance authorizing the use of cameras
- 25 to detect speed violations.
- 26 (d) Automated traffic safety cameras may only take pictures of
- 27 the vehicle and vehicle license plate and only while an infraction
- 28 is occurring. The picture must not reveal the face of the driver or
- 29 of passengers in the vehicle. The primary purpose of camera
- 30 placement is to take pictures of the vehicle and vehicle license
- 31 plate when an infraction is occurring. Cities and counties shall
- 32 consider installing cameras in a manner that minimizes the impact of
- 33 camera flash on drivers.

- 1 (e) A notice of infraction must be mailed to the registered
- 2 owner of the vehicle within fourteen days of the violation, or to
- 3 the renter of a vehicle within fourteen days of establishing the
- 4 renter's name and address under subsection (3)(a) of this section.
- 5 The law enforcement officer issuing the notice of infraction shall
- 6 include with it a certificate or facsimile thereof, based upon
- 7 inspection of photographs, microphotographs, or electronic images
- 8 produced by an automated traffic safety camera, stating the facts
- 9 supporting the notice of infraction. This certificate or facsimile
- 10 is prima facie evidence of the facts contained in it and is
- 11 admissible in a proceeding charging a violation under this chapter.
- 12 The photographs, microphotographs, or electronic images evidencing
- 13 the violation must be available for inspection and admission into
- 14 evidence in a proceeding to adjudicate the liability for the
- 15 infraction. A person receiving a notice of infraction based on
- 16 evidence detected by an automated traffic safety camera may respond
- 17 to the notice by mail.
- 18 (f) The registered owner of a vehicle is responsible for an
- 19 infraction under RCW 46.63.030(1)(d) unless the registered owner
- 20 overcomes the presumption in RCW 46.63.075, or, in the case of a
- 21 rental car business, satisfies the conditions under subsection (3)
- 22 of this section. If appropriate under the circumstances, a renter
- 23 identified under subsection (3)(a) of this section is responsible
- 24 for an infraction.
- 25 (g) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all photographs,
- 26 microphotographs, or electronic images prepared under this section
- 27 are for the exclusive use of law enforcement in the discharge of
- 28 duties under this section and are not open to the public and may not
- 29 be used in a court in a pending action or proceeding unless the
- 30 action or proceeding relates to a violation under this section. No
- 31 photograph, microphotograph, or electronic image may be used for any
- 32 purpose other than enforcement of violations under this section nor
- 33 retained longer than necessary to enforce this section.

- 1 (h) All locations where an automated traffic safety camera is
- 2 used must be clearly marked at least thirty days prior to activation
- 3 of the camera by placing signs in locations that clearly indicate to
- 4 a driver that he or she is entering a zone where traffic laws are
- 5 enforced by an automated traffic safety camera. Signs placed in
- 6 automated traffic safety camera locations after June 7, 2012, must
- 7 follow the specifications and guidelines under the manual of uniform
- 8 traffic control devices for streets and highways as adopted by the
- 9 department of transportation under chapter 47.36 RCW.
- 10 (i) If a county or city has established an authorized automated
- 11 traffic safety camera program under this section, the compensation
- 12 paid to the manufacturer or vendor of the equipment used must be
- 13 based only upon the value of the equipment and services provided or
- 14 rendered in support of the system, and may not be based upon a
- 15 portion of the fine or civil penalty imposed or the revenue
- 16 generated by the equipment.
- 17 (2) During the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium, an automated traffic
- 18 safety camera may not be used to detect a vehicle's failure to stop
- 19 when facing a steady red traffic control signal.
- 20 (3) Infractions detected through the use of automated traffic
- 21 safety cameras are not part of the registered owner's driving record
- 22 under RCW 46.52.101 and 46.52.120. Additionally, infractions
- 23 generated by the use of automated traffic safety cameras under this
- 24 section shall be processed in the same manner as parking
- 25 infractions, including for the purposes of RCW 3.50.100, 35.20.220,
- 26 46.16A.120, and 46.20.270(( $\frac{(3)}{(3)}$ )) (2). The amount of the fine issued
- 27 for an infraction generated through the use of an automated traffic
- 28 safety camera shall not exceed the amount of a fine issued for other
- 29 parking infractions within the jurisdiction. However, the amount of
- 30 the fine issued for a traffic control signal violation detected
- 31 through the use of an automated traffic safety camera shall not
- 32 exceed the monetary penalty for a violation of RCW 46.61.050 as
- 33 provided under RCW 46.63.110, including all applicable statutory
- 34 assessments.

- 1  $((\frac{3}{3}))$  (4) If the registered owner of the vehicle is a rental
- 2 car business, the law enforcement agency shall, before a notice of
- 3 infraction being issued under this section, provide a written notice
- 4 to the rental car business that a notice of infraction may be issued
- 5 to the rental car business if the rental car business does not,
- 6 within eighteen days of receiving the written notice, provide to the
- 7 issuing agency by return mail:
- 8 (a) A statement under oath stating the name and known mailing
- 9 address of the individual driving or renting the vehicle when the
- 10 infraction occurred; or
- 11 (b) A statement under oath that the business is unable to
- 12 determine who was driving or renting the vehicle at the time the
- 13 infraction occurred because the vehicle was stolen at the time of
- 14 the infraction. A statement provided under this subsection must be
- 15 accompanied by a copy of a filed police report regarding the vehicle
- 16 theft; or
- 17 (c) In lieu of identifying the vehicle operator, the rental car
- 18 business may pay the applicable penalty.
- 19 Timely mailing of this statement to the issuing law enforcement
- 20 agency relieves a rental car business of any liability under this
- 21 chapter for the notice of infraction.
- (((4))) (5) Nothing in this section prohibits a law enforcement
- 23 officer from issuing a notice of traffic infraction to a person in
- 24 control of a vehicle at the time a violation occurs under RCW
- 25 46.63.030(1) (a), (b), or (c).
- (((5))) (6) For the purposes of this section, "automated traffic
- 27 safety camera" means a device that uses a vehicle sensor installed
- 28 to work in conjunction with an intersection traffic control system,
- 29 a railroad grade crossing control system, or a speed measuring
- 30 device, and a camera synchronized to automatically record one or
- 31 more sequenced photographs, microphotographs, or electronic images
- 32 of the rear of a motor vehicle at the time the vehicle fails to stop
- 33 when facing a steady red traffic control signal or an activated
- 34 railroad grade crossing control signal, or exceeds a speed limit in

- 1 a school speed zone as detected by a speed measuring device. During
- 2 the 2011-2013 and 2013-2015 fiscal biennia, an automated traffic
- 3 safety camera includes a camera used to detect speed violations for
- 4 the purposes of section 201(2), chapter 367, Laws of 2011 and
- 5 section 201(4), chapter 306, Laws of 2013.
- 6  $((\frac{6}{1}))$  (7) During the 2011-2013 and 2013-2015 fiscal biennia,
- 7 this section does not apply to automated traffic safety cameras for
- 8 the purposes of section 216(5), chapter 367, Laws of 2011 and section
- 9 216(6), chapter 306, Laws of 2013."

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## EFFECT:

- Removes a requirement that the Washington Traffic Safety Commission oversee pilot projects implementing the use of automated traffic safety cameras to detect certain speed violations.
- Removes language that permitted certain local jurisdictions to operate automated traffic safety cameras to detect speed violations in areas outside school zones.
- Prohibits, during the 2015-2017 fiscal biennium, the use of automated traffic safety cameras at stoplights and at the intersections of two arterial roads to detect a vehicle's failure to stop when facing a steady red traffic control signal.
- Prohibits any funds appropriated in the Act form being used to install, maintain, or operate such an automated traffic safety camera.

FISCAL IMPACT: No net change to appropriated levels.

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
