- 4 "Sec. 1. RCW 19.28.191 and 2014 c 156 s 2 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- 6 (1) Upon receipt of the application, the department shall review
- 7 the application and determine whether the applicant is eligible to
- 8 take an examination for the master journey level electrician,
- 9 journey level electrician, master specialty electrician, or
- 10 specialty electrician certificate of competency.
- 11 (a) Before July 1, 2005, an applicant who possesses a valid
- 12 journey level electrician certificate of competency in effect for
- 13 the previous four years and a valid general administrator's
- 14 certificate may apply for a master journey level electrician
- 15 certificate of competency without examination.
- 16 (b) Before July 1, 2005, an applicant who possesses a valid
- 17 specialty electrician certificate of competency, in the specialty
- 18 applied for, for the previous two years and a valid specialty
- 19 administrator's certificate, in the specialty applied for, may apply
- 20 for a master specialty electrician certificate of competency without
- 21 examination.
- 22 (c) Before December 1, 2003, the following persons may obtain an
- 23 equipment repair specialty electrician certificate of competency

- 25 (i) A person who has successfully completed an apprenticeship

- 12 have possessed a valid specialty electrician certificate of

26 the examination, the person may work unsupervised for the balance of
27 the minimum hours required for certification. A person may not be
28 certified as a specialty electrician in the appliance repair
29 specialty or in a specialty other than the designated specialties in
30 (g)(i)(A) of this subsection, however, until the person has worked a
31 minimum of two thousand hours in that specialty, or longer if set by
32 rule by the department; or

- 1 (C) Successfully completed an approved apprenticeship program
 2 under chapter 49.04 RCW for the applicant's specialty in the
- 3 electrical construction trade. (ii) In meeting the training requirements for the pump and 5 irrigation or domestic pump specialties, the individual shall be 6 allowed to obtain the experience required by this section at the 7 same time the individual is meeting the experience required by RCW 8 18.106.040(1)(c). After meeting the training requirements provided 9 in this section, the individual may take the examination and upon 10 passing the examination, meeting additional training requirements as 11 may still be required for those seeking a pump and irrigation, or a 12 domestic pump specialty certificate as defined by rule, and paying 13 the applicable fees, the individual must be issued the appropriate 14 certificate. The department may include an examination for specialty 15 plumbing certificate defined in RCW 18.106.010(10)(c) with the 16 examination required by this section. The department, by rule and in 17 consultation with the electrical board, may establish additional 18 equivalent ways to gain the experience requirements required by this 19 subsection. Individuals who are able to provide evidence to the 20 department, prior to January 1, 2007, that they have been employed 21 as a pump installer in the pump and irrigation or domestic pump 22 business by an appropriately licensed electrical contractor, 23 registered general contractor defined by chapter 18.27 RCW, or 24 appropriate general specialty contractor defined by chapter 18.27 25 RCW for not less than eight thousand hours in the most recent six 26 calendar years shall be issued the appropriate certificate by the 27 department upon receiving such documentation and applicable fees. 28 The department shall establish a single document for those who have 29 received both an electrical specialty certification as defined by 30 this subsection and have also met the certification requirements for 31 the specialty plumber as defined by RCW 18.106.010(10)(c), showing

32 that the individual has received both certifications. No other

33 experience or training requirements may be imposed.

- 1 (iii) Before July 1, 2015, an applicant possessing an electrical
- 2 training certificate issued by the department is eligible to apply
- 3 one hour of every two hours of unsupervised telecommunications

- 14 competency who, after January 1, 2000, has successfully completed a
- 15 two-year program in the electrical construction trade at a public
- 16 community or technical college, or a not-for-profit nationally
- 17 accredited technical or trade school licensed by the workforce
- 18 training and education coordinating board under chapter 28C.10 RCW,
- 19 may substitute up to one year of the technical or trade school
- 20 program for one year of work experience under a master journey level
- 21 electrician, journey level electrician, master specialty electrician
- 22 working in that electrician's specialty, or specialty electrician
- 23 working in that electrician's specialty. Any applicant who has
- 24 received training in the electrical construction trade in the armed
- 25 services of the United States may be eligible to apply armed service

- 28 (j) The department must determine whether hours of training and
- 29 experience in the armed services or school program are in the
- 30 electrical construction trade and appropriate as a substitute for
- 31 hours of work experience. The department must use the following
- 32 criteria for evaluating the equivalence of classroom electrical
- 33 training programs and work in the electrical construction trade:

- 1 (i) A two-year electrical training program must consist of three
- 2 thousand or more hours.
- 3 (ii) In a two-year electrical training program, a minimum of two
- 4 thousand four hundred hours of student/instructor contact time must
- 5 be technical electrical instruction directly related to the scope of
- 6 work of the electrical specialty. Student/instructor contact time
- 7 includes lecture and in-school lab.
- 8 (iii) The department may not allow credit for a program that
- 9 accepts more than one thousand hours transferred from another
- 10 school's program.
- 11 (iv) Electrical specialty training school programs of less than
- 12 two years will have all of the above student/instructor contact time
- 13 hours proportionately reduced. Such programs may not apply to more
- 14 than fifty percent of the work experience required to attain
- 15 certification.
- 16 (v) Electrical training programs of less than two years may not
- 17 be credited towards qualification for journey level electrician
- 18 unless the training program is used to gain qualification for a four
- 19 thousand hour electrical specialty.
- 20 (k) No other requirement for eligibility may be imposed.
- 21 (2) The department shall establish reasonable rules for the
- 22 examinations to be given applicants for certificates of competency.
- 23 In establishing the rules, the department shall consult with the

- 33 **Sec. 2.** RCW 19.28.211 and 2013 c 23 s 33 are each amended to
- 34 read as follows:

- (1) The department shall issue a certificate of competency to 1 2 all applicants who have passed the examination provided in RCW 3 19.28.201, met the in-class education requirements of RCW 19.28.205 4 if applicable, and who have complied with RCW 19.28.161 through 5 19.28.271 and the rules adopted under this chapter. An applicant who 6 qualified for certification by completing a journey level or 7 residential specialty electrical construction trade apprenticeship 8 under chapter 49.04 RCW shall be issued a journey level or 9 residential specialty certificate of competency, as applicable, or 10 master journey level or master residential specialty certificate of 11 competency, as applicable, if the applicant otherwise qualifies 12 under this chapter, with an indication that the individual completed 13 a journey level or residential specialty electrical construction 14 trade apprenticeship program under chapter 49.04 15 certificate may include a photograph of the holder. The certificate 16 shall bear the date of issuance, and shall expire on the holder's 17 birthday. The certificate shall be renewed every three years, upon 18 application, on or before the holder's birthdate. A fee shall be 19 assessed for each certificate and for each annual renewal.
- (2) If the certificate holder demonstrates to the department that he or she has satisfactorily completed an annual eight-hour continuing education course, the certificate may be renewed without examination by appropriate application unless the certificate has been revoked, suspended, or not renewed within ninety days after the expiration date. For pump and irrigation or domestic pump specialty electricians, the continuing education course may combine both electrical and plumbing education provided that there is a minimum of four hours of electrical training in the course.
- 29 (a) The contents and requirements for satisfactory completion of 30 the continuing education course shall be determined by the director 31 and approved by the board.
- 32 (b) The department shall accept proof of a certificate holder's 33 satisfactory completion of a continuing education course offered in 34 another state as meeting the requirements for maintaining a current

- 1 Washington state certificate of competency if the department is
- 2 satisfied the course is comparable in nature to that required in
- 3 Washington state for maintaining a current certificate of
- 4 competency.
- 5 (3) If the certificate is not renewed before the expiration
- 6 date, the individual shall pay twice the usual fee. The department
- 7 shall set the fees by rule for issuance and renewal of a certificate
- 8 of competency. The fees shall cover but not exceed the costs of
- 9 issuing the certificates and of administering and enforcing the
- 10 electrician certification requirements of this chapter.
- 11 (4) The certificates of competency and temporary permits
- 12 provided for in this chapter grant the holder the right to work in
- 13 the electrical construction trade as a master electrician, journey
- 14 level electrician, or specialty electrician in accordance with their
- 15 provisions throughout the state and within any of its political
- 16 subdivisions without additional proof of competency or any other
- 17 license, permit, or fee to engage in such work."

 $\underline{\mathtt{EFFECT:}}$ Strikes the underlying House Bill and provides that:

- 1. An applicant for a journey level or residential specialty electrician certificate of competency, or master journey level or residential specialty electrician certificate, who qualified by completing an apprenticeship must be issued a certificate indicating that the electrician completed an apprenticeship program.
- 2. Before January 1, 2019, an individual employed by a school district may apply one hour for every two hours worked in the electrical trade toward taking the examination for the following specialty electrician certificates of competency: limited energy, HVAC/refrigeration systems, and nonresidential maintenance.
