- 1. 3 "NEW SECTION. Sec. INTENT. Paraeducators provide the majority of instruction in programs designed by the legislature to 4 5 reduce the opportunity gap. By setting common statewide standards, training, and career development for paraeducators, as well 6 7 training for teachers and principals who have paraeducators in their classrooms, students in these programs have a better chance of 8 9 succeeding in the classroom.
- 10 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. DEFINITIONS. The definitions in this 11 section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly 12 requires otherwise.
- 13 "Board" means the professional educator standards board (1)14 created in RCW 28A.410.200.
- 15 "Committee" means the paraeducator professional practices committee established in section 4 of this act. 16
- (3) "English language learner endorsement" means a credential to 17 18 work with students in English language learner programs.
- 19 "English language learner programs" means the 20 language learners program, the transitional bilingual instruction program, and the federal limited English proficiency program. 21
- 22 (5) "Paraeducator" means a school district employee who works under the supervision of a certificated staff member to support and 23 24 assist in providing instructional and other services to students and 25 their families.
- Sec. 3. EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS. Effective September 26 NEW SECTION.
- 27 1, 2015, the minimum employment entry standards for a paraeducator
- 28 works learning assistance program, in the
- 29 disadvantaged programs, and the English language learner programs are
- 30 as provided in this section. The paraeducator must:

- 1 (1) Be at least eighteen years of age, hold a high school diploma 2 or its equivalent, and have received a passing grade on the education testing service paraeducator assessment; 3
 - (2) Hold an associate of arts degree; or

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- (3) Have earned seventy-two quarter credits or forty-eight 5 6 semester credits at an institution of higher education.
 - PARAEDUCATOR PROFESSIONAL PRACTICES NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. COMMITTEE. (1) By September 1, 2015, the board shall establish a paraeducator professional practices committee to advise the board, the state board for community and technical colleges, and the office of the superintendent of public instruction on the training and development of paraeducators.
 - (2) Appointments to the committee must be made as follows:
- (a) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint a 14 paraeducator, a teacher, a principal, and a human resource director; 15
 - (b) The Washington state parent teacher association shall appoint parent whose child receives instructional support from a paraeducator;
- 19 (c) The state board for community and technical colleges shall 20 appoint a representative of the community or technical college 21 system; and
- 22 student achievement council (d) The shall appoint 23 representative of a four-year institution of higher education as 24 defined in RCW 28B.10.016.
- 25 (3) The board shall oversee and administer the committee.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. STANDARDS AND COURSES OF STUDY. (1) The 26 board shall adopt state standards of practice for paraeducators 27 working in the learning assistance program, the federal disadvantaged 28 29 programs, and the English language learner programs that are based on the recommendations of the paraeducator work group established in 30 chapter 136, Laws of 2014. These standards must include: 31
 - (a) Supporting instructional opportunities;
- 33 (b) Demonstrating professionalism and ethical practices;
- 34 (c) Supporting a positive and safe learning environment;
- (d) Communicating effectively and participating in the team 35 process; and 36
- Demonstrating cultural competency aligned with 37 standards developed by the board under RCW 28A.410.270. 38

- 1 (2) The board shall adopt standards and rules for the issuance of 2 an English language learner endorsement, based on the recommendations 3 of the paraeducator work group established in chapter 136, Laws of 4 2014.
- (3) The committee shall propose that the board adopt standards 5 6 and rules for the issuance of advanced paraeducator endorsement. 7 These standards and the course of study necessary to meet the standards, as approved under subsection (4) of this section, must 8 9 advanced paraeducator to fulfill the responsibilities: Mentor or coach other paraeducators, assist in 10 11 impacted classrooms, assist in specific specialized instruction support or technology applications, and substitute for 12 teachers in short absence situations in districts with substitute 13 14 teacher shortages.
 - (4)(a) The committee, in collaboration with the state board for community and technical colleges, the office of the superintendent of public instruction, and the educational service districts, must recommend to the board the course of study necessary to meet the state standards of practice and the endorsement standards adopted by the board under this section.

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- (b) The courses of study must be made available through various means to limit costs and improve access with providers including the community and technical colleges, the educational service districts, and the office of the superintendent of public instruction.
- 25 (c) The deadlines for the board to approve courses of study are 26 as follows:
- 27 (i) July 1, 2016, for the course of study necessary to meet the 28 state standards of practice and the English language learner 29 endorsement; and
- 30 (ii) September 1, 2017, for the course of study necessary to meet 31 the advanced paraeducator endorsement.
- 32 (5) To support the tasks in this section, the committee and the 33 board may consult with experts.
- 34 (6) This section is subject to the availability of amounts 35 appropriated for this specific purpose.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. PILOTS. (1) During the 2016-17 and 2017-18 school years, the board shall distribute grants, as funded by the legislature, to a diverse set of school districts that volunteer to participate in a collaborative process resulting in the development

and piloting of the state paraeducator standards of practice and the English language learner endorsement standards adopted by the board under section 5 of this act.

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- (2) By September 1, 2017, and September 1, 2018, the volunteer districts must report to the committee and the board with the outcomes of year one of the pilot and any recommendations for implementing the paraeducator standards of practice statewide. The outcomes reported must include: An analysis of the costs to the district to implement the state standards of practice and the English language learner endorsement standards and the course of study necessary to meet these standards; any costs to paraeducators to meet the standards; the number of paraeducators in the district that meet the standards; and the impact on the size and assignment of the paraeducator workforce as a result of the pilot.
- (3) By December 1, 2017, the committee and the board shall submit a report to the appropriate committees of the legislature that includes: (a) The outcomes of the pilot; (b) recommendations on whether the state should implement the standards of practice and the English language learner endorsement standards statewide with estimated costs of statewide implementation to the state and to districts; and (c) the effects of establishing a system of continuing education, licensure, endorsement, or alternative training verification processes and fees. In developing the report, the committee and the board shall collaborate with the office of the superintendent of public instruction, the educational service districts, the state board for community and technical colleges, and the school districts receiving grants under this section.
- (4) The committee and the board shall include in the board's 2018 joint report to the legislature under RCW 28A.305.035 an update of the report required in subsection (3) of this section.
- 31 (5) This section is subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this specific purpose. 32
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. STATEWIDE IMPLEMENTATION. (1) No later 33 than September 1, 2018, all school districts must begin implementing 34 35 the state standards of practice for paraeducators working in the learning assistance program, the federal disadvantaged programs, and 36 English language learner programs, according to a phase-in 37 38 schedule specified by the legislature.

- 1 (2) This section is subject to the availability of amounts 2 appropriated for this specific purpose.
- RCW 28A.410.212 and 2009 c 531 s 1 are each amended to 3 read as follows: 4
- 5 The professional educator standards board shall:

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- (1) Develop and maintain a research base of educator preparation 6 7 best practices;
- (2) Develop and coordinate initiatives for educator preparation 8 in high-demand fields as well as outreach and recruitment initiatives 9 10 for underrepresented populations;
- (3) Provide program improvement technical assistance to providers 11 12 of educator preparation programs;
 - (4) Assure educator preparation program compliance; ((and))
- (5) Prepare and maintain a cohesive educator development policy 14 15 framework; and
- (6) Perform the duties related to paraeducators provided in 16 chapter 28A.--- RCW (the new chapter created in section 11 of this 17 18 act).
- 19 Sec. 9. RCW 28A.630.400 and 2011 1st sp.s. c 11 s 132 are each 20 amended to read as follows:
 - (1) The professional educator standards board and the state board for community and technical colleges, in consultation with the superintendent of public instruction, the state apprenticeship training council, and community colleges, shall adopt rules as necessary under chapter 34.05 RCW to implement the paraeducator associate of arts degree.
 - (2) As used in this section, a "paraeducator" is an individual who has completed an associate of arts degree for a paraeducator. The paraeducator may be hired by a school district to assist certificated instructional staff in the direct instruction of children in small and large groups, individualized instruction, testing of children, recordkeeping, and preparation of materials. The paraeducator shall work under the direction of instructional certificated staff.
- 34 (3)(a) The training program for a paraeducator associate of arts degree shall include, but is not limited to, the general requirements 35 for receipt of an associate of arts degree and training in the areas 36 of introduction to childhood education, orientation to children with 37 disabilities, fundamentals of childhood education, creative 38

- activities for children, instructional materials for children, fine 1 for children, the psychology of 2 experiences introduction to education, child health and safety, child development 3 and guidance, first aid, and a practicum in a school setting. 4
 - (b) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, by September 1, 2016, the training program for a paraeducator associate of arts degree must incorporate the state paraeducator standards of practice adopted by the professional educator standards board under section 5 of this act.
- (4) Consideration shall be given to transferability of credit 10 earned in this program to teacher preparation programs at colleges 11 12 and universities.
- 13 Sec. 10. RCW 28B.50.891 and 2014 c 136 s 4 are each amended to read as follows: 14
- 15 Beginning with the ((2015-16)) 2016-17 academic year, any 16 community or technical college that offers an apprenticeship program 17 or certificate program for paraeducators must provide candidates the 18 opportunity to earn transferrable course credits within the program. The programs must also incorporate the standards for cultural 19 20 competence, including multicultural education and principles language acquisition, developed by the professional educator 21 standards board under RCW 28A.410.270. Subject to the availability of 22 amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, by September 1, 2016, 23 24 the paraeducator apprenticeship and certificate programs must also incorporate the state paraeducator standards of practice adopted by 25 the professional educator standards board under section 5 of this 26 27 act.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 11. Sections 1 through 7 of this act 28 29 constitute a new chapter in Title 28A RCW."
