## SHB 2496 - S COMM AMD By Committee on Ways & Means

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 2 following:

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- 4 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) There is hereby created an office of
- 5 military and veteran legal assistance within the office of the
- 6 attorney general for the purpose of promoting and facilitating civil
- 7 legal assistance programs, pro bono services, and self-help services
- 8 for military service members, veterans, and their family members
- 9 domiciled or stationed in Washington state.
- 10 (2) For the purposes of sections 1 through 3 of this act, the
- 11 following definitions apply:
- 12 (a) The term "service member" means an active or reserve member
- 13 in any branch of the armed forces of the United States, including
- 14 the national guard, coast guard, and armed forces reserves.
- 15 (b) The term "veteran" has the same meaning as defined in RCW
- 16 41.04.005 and 41.04.007.
- 17 (c) The term "family member" means the spouse or domestic
- 18 partner, surviving spouse, surviving domestic partner, and dependent
- 19 minor children of a living or deceased service member or veteran for
- 20 whom the service member or veteran provided at least one-half of
- 21 that person's support in the previous one hundred eighty days before
- 22 seeking assistance of the programs and services authorized by this
- 23 chapter.
- 24 (3) The attorney general may not directly provide legal
- 25 assistance, advice, or representation in any context, unless
- 26 otherwise authorized by law, and the attorney general may not
- 27 provide legal assistance programs, pro bono services, or self-help

1 services to a service member, veteran, or family member being

2 criminally prosecuted.

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- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The office of military and veteran legal 5 assistance shall:
- 6 (1) Recruit and train volunteer attorneys and service programs
- 7 willing to perform pro bono services for service members, veterans,
- 8 and their family members, and create and maintain a registry of the
- 9 same;
- 10 (2) Assess and assign requests for pro bono services to
- 11 volunteer attorneys and service programs registered with the office;
- 12 and
- 13 (3) Establish an advisory committee that will include, among
- 14 others, representatives from legal assistance offices on military
- 15 installations, the office of civil legal aid, the Washington state
- 16 bar association's legal assistance to military personnel section,
- 17 the Washington state veterans bar association, relevant office of
- 18 military service and support organizations, and organizations
- 19 involved in coordinating, supporting, and delivering civil legal aid
- 20 and pro bono legal services in Washington state. The committee shall
- 21 provide advice and assistance regarding program design, operation,
- 22 volunteer recruitment and support strategies, service delivery
- 23 objectives and priorities, and funding.

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- 25 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** The attorney general may apply for and
- 26 receive grants, gifts, donations, bequests, or other contributions
- 27 to help support and to be used exclusively for the operations of the
- 28 office of military and veteran legal assistance.

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- 30 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. (1) Any attorney who is licensed to
- 31 practice law in this state and who renders pro bono services for the
- 32 office of military and veteran legal assistance is not liable for
- 33 any civil damages as a result of any act or omission by the attorney

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- 1 in rendering such services if the services were rendered in good
- 2 faith and in a manner not amounting to gross negligence.
- 3 (2) The state is not liable in any civil action for any
- 4 deleterious outcomes from the activities described in section 2 of
- 5 this act.

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7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 5.** Sections 1 through 4 of this act are each 8 added to chapter 43.10 RCW."

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<u>EFFECT:</u> Restores language to the bill that provides immunity from liability for volunteer legal services provided under the bill.

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
