EFFECT: Provides funding for 1.0 FTE or a contract with a Native early child care and education specialist position at the Department of Early Learning. This position will be responsible for coordinating culturally competent technical assistance for early child care and education programs serving American Indian and Alaska Native children and their families and seeking funds to develop and implement, in collaboration with tribal nations, support services to expand the number of tribal child care providers; increase professional development opportunities for early child care and education professional serving American Indian and Alaska Native children; facilitate the inclusion of native language programs in early child care and education programs serving Alaska Native children and their families.

FISCAL EFFECT: \$276,000 GF-S funded from Marijuana Excise taxes.

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
