1 On page 3, beginning on line 10, after "subsection" strike all
2 material through "66.24.175" on line 11 and insert "do not include
3 tasting or sampling privileges"

4 Beginning on page 4, line 17, after "wineries" strike all
5 material through "distillery" on page 5, line 9 and insert "or
6 microbreweries combined may offer samples at a qualifying farmers
7 market per day.

8 (b) Samples must be two ounces or less. A winery or microbrewery
9 may provide a maximum of two ounces of wine or beer to a customer per
10 day.

11 (c) A winery or microbrewery may advertise that it offers samples
12 only at its designated booth, stall, or other designated location at
13 the farmers market.

14 (d) Customers must remain at the designated booth, stall, or
15 other designated location while sampling beer or wine.

16 (e) Winery and microbrewery licensees and employees who are
17 involved in sampling activities under this section must hold a class
18 12 or class 13 alcohol server permit.

19 (f) A winery or microbrewery must have food available for
20 customers to consume while sampling beer or wine, or must be adjacent
21 to a vendor offering prepared food.

22 (3) The board may establish additional requirements to ensure
23 that persons under twenty-one years of age and apparently intoxicated
24 persons may not possess or consume alcohol under the authority
25 granted in this section.

26 (4) The board may prohibit sampling at a farmers market that is
27 within the boundaries of an alcohol impact area recognized by
28 resolution of the board if the board finds that the sampling
29 activities at the farmers market have an adverse effect on the
30 reduction of chronic public inebriation in the area.

31 (5) If a winery or microbrewery"

EFFECT: Removes the authorization to sample spirits at farmers markets and replaces it with a prohibition on sampling spirits at farmers markets.

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
