3 TEACHER SALARIES

Sec. 501. RCW 28A.400.200 and 2010 c 235 s 401 are each amended to read as follows:

- (1) Every school district board of directors shall fix, alter, allow, and order paid salaries and compensation for all district employees in conformance with this section.
- (2)(a) Salaries for certificated instructional staff shall not be less than the salary provided in the appropriations act in the statewide salary allocation schedule for an employee with a baccalaureate degree and zero years of service((; and)).
- (b) Salaries for certificated instructional staff with a master's degree shall not be less than the salary provided in the appropriations act in the statewide salary allocation schedule for an employee with a master's degree and zero years of service.
- (c)(i) In the 2018-19 school year, the minimum salary for any level of experience and education provided in any salary allocation model used in state funding formulas for certificated instructional staff allocations shall not be less than the beginning educator pay recommendations from the compensation technical working group report from 2012 adjusted for inflation since the release of the report.
- (ii) For the 2016-17 school year through the 2018-19 school year, the phase in of the new minimum salary allocation shall be made in generally equal annual increments necessary to achieve the full phase in of beginning educator pay recommendations adjusted for inflation by the 2018-19 school year.
- 28 <u>(iii) The compensation technical working group's salary</u>
 29 <u>allocation recommendations were based on comparable wage analyses</u>
 30 <u>from the time of the report. When fully enacted in the 2018-19 school</u>
 31 <u>year, the minimum salary allocation for any level of experience and</u>

- education shall adjust the forty-eight thousand six hundred eightyseven dollars beginning educator allocation recommended in the report
 for annual cost-of-living increases from the 2011-12 school year to
 the 2018-19 school year using the cost-of-living index.
 - (iv) For the purposes of this subsection (2)(c), "cost-of-living index" means, for any school year, the previous calendar year's annual average consumer price index, using the official current base, compiled by the bureau of labor statistics, United States department of labor for the state of Washington. If the bureau of labor statistics develops more than one consumer price index for areas within the state, the index covering the greatest number of people, covering areas exclusively within the boundaries of the state, and including all items shall be used for the cost-of-living index in this section.
 - (3)(a) The actual average salary paid to certificated instructional staff shall not exceed the district's average certificated instructional staff salary used for the state basic education allocations for that school year as determined pursuant to RCW 28A.150.410.
 - (b) Fringe benefit contributions for certificated instructional staff shall be included as salary under (a) of this subsection only to the extent that the district's actual average benefit contribution exceeds the amount of the insurance benefits allocation provided per instructional staff unit certificated in the state appropriations act in effect at the time the compensation is payable. For purposes of this section, fringe benefits shall not include payment for unused leave for illness or injury under RCW 28A.400.210; employer contributions for old age survivors insurance, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, and retirement benefits the Washington state retirement system; or contributions for health benefits in excess of the insurance benefits allocation provided per certificated instructional staff unit in the state operating appropriations act in effect at the time the compensation is payable. A school district may not use state funds to provide employer contributions for such excess health benefits.
 - (c) Salary and benefits for certificated instructional staff in programs other than basic education shall be consistent with the salary and benefits paid to certificated instructional staff in the basic education program.

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- (4) Salaries and benefits for certificated instructional staff 1 2 may exceed the limitations in subsection (3) of this section only by contract for additional time, for 3 additional responsibilities, for incentives, or for 4 implementing specific measurable innovative activities, including professional development, 5 6 specified by the school district to: (a) Close one or 7 achievement gaps, (b) focus on development of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) learning opportunities, or (c) 8 provide arts education. Beginning September 1, 2011, school districts 9 shall annually provide a brief description of the innovative 10 11 activities included in any supplemental contract to the office of the 12 public instruction. superintendent of The office $\circ f$ the superintendent of public instruction shall summarize the district 13 information and submit an annual report to the education committees 14 the house of representatives and the senate. Supplemental 15 16 contracts shall not cause the state to incur any present or future 17 funding obligation. Supplemental contracts shall be subject to the collective bargaining provisions of chapter 41.59 RCW and the 18 provisions of RCW 28A.405.240, shall not exceed one year, and if not 19 20 renewed shall not constitute adverse change in accordance with RCW 21 28A.405.300 through 28A.405.380. No district may enter supplemental contract under this subsection for the provision of 22 services which are a part of the basic education program required by 23 24 Article IX, section 3 of the state Constitution.
- 25 (5) Employee benefit plans offered by any district shall comply 26 with RCW 28A.400.350 ((and)), 28A.400.275, and 28A.400.280."
