- 1 AN ACT Relating to creating a task force on school counselors,
- 2 psychologists, and social workers; creating a new section; and
- 3 providing an expiration date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1)(a) The Washington professional
- 6 educator standards board shall convene a task force on school
- 7 counselors, psychologists, and social workers, with members as
- 8 provided in this subsection.
- 9 (i) The president of the senate shall appoint one member from the 10 early learning and K-12 education committee.
- 11 (ii) The speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint 12 one member from the education committee.
- 13 (iii) The governor shall appoint one member representing school 14 counselor, psychologist, and social worker preparation programs.
- 15 (iv) The superintendent of public instruction shall appoint one 16 member representing the office of the superintendent of public 17 instruction.
- 18 (v) The professional educator standards board shall appoint one 19 member representing the professional educator standards board.
- 20 (vi) The professional educator standards board shall appoint one 21 member each from associations representing: School counselors; school

- 1 psychologists; school social workers; educators; and principals.
- 2 Appointments made under this subsection (1)(a)(vi) must be from lists of candidates provided by the associations.
 - (b) The professional educator standards board must provide staff support for the task force.
 - (c) Appointments made under this section by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives must be from different political parties.
 - (2) The task force shall review the following issues:
- 10 (a) The projected need of school districts for school counselors, 11 psychologists, and social workers;
 - (b) The current capacity of the state for meeting this need;
- 13 (c) Alternative certification routes for school counselors and 14 social workers; and
 - (d) School counselor, psychologist, and social worker preparation programs to determine whether professionals completing these programs have the proper preparation to respond to the mental health and safety needs of students, and to provide students with necessary social and emotional supports.
 - (3) The task force must, in accordance with RCW 43.01.036, report its findings and recommendations to the appropriate committees of the legislature, the professional educator standards board, the superintendent of public instruction, and the governor by December 1, 2016.
- 25 (4) This section expires July 1, 2017.
