SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 2767

1 AN ACT Relating to defining and using the term center-based 2 services for individuals with developmental disabilities; amending 3 RCW 71A.12.080; and reenacting and amending RCW 71A.10.020.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 71A.10.020 and 2014 c 139 s 2 are each reenacted and 6 amended to read as follows:

7 As used in this title, the following terms have the meanings 8 indicated unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

9 (1) "Assessment" means an evaluation is provided by the 10 department to determine:

11 (a) If the individual meets functional and financial criteria for 12 medicaid services; and

13

(b) The individual's support needs for service determination.

14 (2) "Center-based services" means job-training, skill development, and community employment services provided by a 15 16 qualified organization for individuals with significant disabilities. 17 Services can be provided at a facility, or any portion thereof, or at an integrated community site operated by the corporation, where 18 business work activities are carried on and whose primary purpose is 19 to provide gainful employment training and preparatory training 20 21 services to individuals with disabilities who are not prepared for

1 competitive employment, or during such time as employment 2 opportunities for the individual in the competitive labor market do 3 not exist; services may include: Skill evaluation, job training, and 4 other employment-related services for individuals with developmental 5 and other significant disabilities whose mental, emotional, or 6 physical limitations keep them from obtaining work in the competitive 7 labor market.

8 (3) "Community residential support services," or "community 9 support services," and "in-home services" means one or more of the 10 services listed in RCW 71A.12.040.

11 (((3))) (4) "Crisis stabilization services" means services 12 provided to persons with developmental disabilities who are 13 experiencing behaviors that jeopardize the safety and stability of 14 their current living situation. Crisis stabilization services 15 include:

(a) Temporary intensive services and supports, typically not to
exceed sixty days, to prevent psychiatric hospitalization,
institutional placement, or other out-of-home placement; and

(b) Services designed to stabilize the person and strengthen their current living situation so the person may continue to safely reside in the community during and beyond the crisis period.

22 (((4))) (5) "Department" means the department of social and 23 health services.

((((5))) <u>(6)</u> "Developmental disability" means a disability 24 25 attributable to intellectual disability, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism, or another neurological or other condition of an individual 26 found by the secretary to be closely related to an intellectual 27 28 disability or to require treatment similar to that required for 29 individuals with intellectual disabilities, which disability originates before the individual attains age eighteen, which has 30 31 continued or can be expected to continue indefinitely, and which 32 constitutes a substantial limitation to the individual. By January 1, 1989, the department shall promulgate rules which define neurological 33 or other conditions in a way that is not limited to intelligence 34 quotient scores as the sole determinant of these conditions, and 35 notify the legislature of this action. 36

37 (((-6))) (7) "Eligible person" means a person who has been found 38 by the secretary under RCW 71A.16.040 to be eligible for services.

39 (((7))) (8) "Habilitative services" means those services provided 40 by program personnel to assist persons in acquiring and maintaining

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life skills and to raise their levels of physical, mental, social,
and vocational functioning. Habilitative services include education,
training for employment, and therapy.

4 (((8))) (9) "Legal representative" means a parent of a person who 5 is under eighteen years of age, a person's legal guardian, a person's 6 limited guardian when the subject matter is within the scope of the 7 limited guardianship, a person's attorney-at-law, a person's 8 attorney-in-fact, or any other person who is authorized by law to act 9 for another person.

10 (((9))) (10) "Notice" or "notification" of an action of the 11 secretary means notice in compliance with RCW 71A.10.060.

12 (((10))) <u>(11)</u> "Residential habilitation center" means a state-13 operated facility for persons with developmental disabilities 14 governed by chapter 71A.20 RCW.

(((11))) (12) "Respite services" means relief for families and 15 16 other caregivers of people with disabilities, typically not to exceed 17 ninety days, to include both in-home and out-of-home respite care on an hourly and daily basis, including twenty-four hour care for 18 several consecutive days. Respite care workers provide supervision, 19 companionship, and personal care services temporarily replacing those 20 21 provided by the primary caregiver of the person with disabilities. Respite care may include other services needed by the client, 22 including medical care which must be provided by a licensed health 23 24 care practitioner.

25 (((12))) (13) "Secretary" means the secretary of social and 26 health services or the secretary's designee.

27 (((13))) (14) "Service" or "services" means services provided by 28 state or local government to carry out this title.

29 (((14))) (15) "Service request list" means a list of eligible 30 persons who have received an assessment for service determination and 31 their assessment shows that they meet the eligibility requirements 32 for the requested service but were denied access due to funding 33 limits.

34 (((15))) (16) "State-operated living alternative" means programs 35 for community residential services which may include assistance with 36 activities of daily living, behavioral, habilitative, interpersonal, 37 protective, medical, nursing, and mobility supports to individuals 38 who have been assessed by the department as meeting state and federal 39 requirements for eligibility in home and community-based waiver 40 programs for individuals with developmental disabilities. Stateoperated living alternatives are operated and staffed with state
employees.

((((16))) (17) "Supported living" means community residential 3 services and housing which may include assistance with activities of 4 daily living, behavioral, habilitative, interpersonal, protective, 5 6 medical, nursing, and mobility supports provided to individuals with 7 disabilities who have been assessed by the department as meeting state and federal requirements for eligibility in home and community-8 for individuals 9 based waiver programs with developmental disabilities. Supported living services are provided under contracts 10 11 with private agencies or with individuals who are not state 12 employees.

13 (((17))) (18) "Vacancy" means an opening at a residential 14 habilitation center, which when filled, would not require the center 15 to exceed its biennially budgeted capacity.

16 **Sec. 2.** RCW 71A.12.080 and 1988 c 176 s 208 are each amended to 17 read as follows:

18 (1) The secretary shall adopt rules concerning the eligibility of residents of residential habilitation centers for placement 19 in 20 community residential programs under this title; determination of 21 ability of such persons or their estates to pay all or a portion of the cost of care, support, and training; the manner and method of 22 licensing or certification and inspection and approval of such 23 24 community residential programs for placement under this title; and 25 procedures for the payment of costs of care, maintenance, and training in community residential programs. The rules shall include 26 27 standards for care, maintenance, and training to be met by such 28 community residential programs.

(2) The secretary shall coordinate state activities and resources relating to placement in community residential programs to help efficiently expend state and local resources and, to the extent designated funds are available, create an effective community residential program.

34 <u>(3) The secretary shall adopt rules and revise existing rules to</u> 35 <u>ensure that the term "center-based services" is used to refer to</u> 36 <u>services meeting the definition provided in RCW 71A.10.020.</u>

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
