SENATE BILL 5064

State of Washington 64th Legislature 2015 Regular Session

By Senators Hill, Ericksen, Dammeier, Sheldon, Warnick, Frockt, Hewitt, and Mullet

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1 AN ACT Relating to providing that a quarterly revenue forecast is 2 due on February 20th during both a long and short legislative session 3 year; reenacting and amending RCW 82.33.020; and declaring an 4 emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 Sec. 1. RCW 82.33.020 and 2012 1st sp.s. c 8 s 3 and 2012 c 182 7 s 1 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

8 (1) Four times each year the supervisor must prepare, subject to 9 the approval of the economic and revenue forecast council under RCW 10 82.33.010:

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(a) An official state economic and revenue forecast;

(b) An unofficial state economic and revenue forecast based onoptimistic economic and revenue projections; and

14 (c) An unofficial state economic and revenue forecast based on15 pessimistic economic and revenue projections.

16 (2) The supervisor must submit forecasts prepared under this 17 section, along with any unofficial forecasts provided under RCW 18 82.33.010, to the governor and the members of the committees on ways 19 and means and the chairs of the committees on transportation of the 20 senate and house of representatives, including one copy to the staff 21 of each of the committees, on or before November 20th, February 20th

1 ((in the even-numbered years, March 20th in the odd-numbered years)), June 27th, and September 27th. All forecasts must include both 2 estimated receipts and estimated revenues in conformance 3 with generally accepted accounting principles as provided 4 by RCW 43.88.037. In odd-numbered years, the period covered by forecasts for 5 6 the state general fund and related funds must cover the current 7 fiscal biennium and the next ensuing fiscal biennium. In evennumbered years, the period covered by the forecasts for the state 8 general fund and related funds shall be current fiscal and the next 9 two ensuing fiscal biennia. 10

11 (3) All agencies of state government must provide to the 12 supervisor immediate access to all information relating to economic 13 and revenue forecasts. Revenue collection information must be 14 available to the supervisor the first business day following the 15 conclusion of each collection period.

16 (4) The economic and revenue forecast supervisor and staff must 17 co-locate and share information, data, and files with the tax 18 research section of the department of revenue but may not duplicate 19 the duties and functions of one another.

20 (5) As part of its forecasts under subsection (1) of this 21 section, the supervisor must provide estimated revenue from tuition 22 fees as defined in RCW 28B.15.020.

The economic and revenue forecast council 23 (6) must, in consultation with the economic and revenue forecast work group 24 25 created in RCW 82.33.040, review the existing economic and revenue 26 forecast council revenue model, data, and methodologies and in light 27 of recent economic changes, engage outside experts if necessary, and recommend changes to the economic and revenue forecast council 28 29 revenue forecasting process to increase confidence and promote accuracy in the revenue forecast. The recommendations are due by 30 31 September 30, 2012, and every five years thereafter.

32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 33 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 34 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 35 effect immediately.

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
