1 AN ACT Relating to reimbursing the criminal justice training 2 commission for basic law enforcement training; amending RCW 3 43.101.200; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 Sec. 1. RCW 43.101.200 and 2013 2nd sp.s. c 4 s 982 are each 6 amended to read as follows:

(1) All law enforcement personnel, except volunteers, and reserve 7 officers whether paid or unpaid, initially employed on or after 8 January 1, 1978, shall engage in basic law enforcement training which 9 10 complies with standards adopted by the commission pursuant to RCW 11 43.101.080. For personnel initially employed before January 1, 1990, such training shall be successfully completed during the first 12 13 fifteen months of employment of such personnel unless otherwise 14 extended or waived by the commission and shall be requisite to the continuation of such employment. Personnel initially employed on or 15 16 after January 1, 1990, shall commence basic training during the first six months of employment unless the basic training requirement is 17 otherwise waived or extended by the commission. Successful completion 18 19 of basic training is requisite to the continuation of employment of 20 such personnel initially employed on or after January 1, 1990.

1 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, the commission shall provide the aforementioned training together with necessary 2 facilities, supplies, materials, and the board and room 3 of noncommuting attendees for seven days per week((, except during the 4 2013-2015 fiscal biennium when the employing, county, city, or state 5 б law enforcement agency shall reimburse the commission for twenty-five percent of the cost of training its personnel. Additionally, to the 7 extent funds are provided for this purpose, the commission shall 8 reimburse to participating law enforcement agencies with ten or less 9 10 full-time commissioned patrol officers the cost of temporary replacement of each officer who is enrolled in basic law enforcement 11 training: PROVIDED, That such reimbursement shall include only the 12 actual cost of temporary replacement not to exceed the total amount 13 of salary and benefits received by the replaced officer during his or 14 her training period)). Effective July 1, 2015, the county or city 15 16 agency that employs the law enforcement personnel shall reimburse the 17 commission for the total cost of training its personnel.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 19 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 20 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 21 effect July 1, 2015.
