1 AN ACT Relating to emergency drought response; adding a new 2 section to 2013 2nd sp.s. c 19 (uncodified); creating new sections; 3 making appropriations; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. (1) Subject to the provisions set forth in 6 this act, the several dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so 7 much thereof as shall be sufficient to accomplish the purposes 8 designated, are hereby appropriated and authorized to be incurred for 9 capital projects during the period beginning with the effective date 10 of this section and ending June 30, 2017, out of the several funds 11 specified in this act.

12 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act13 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

(a) "Fiscal year 2016" or "FY 2016" means the period beginningJuly 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2016.

16 (b) "Fiscal year 2017" or "FY 2017" means the period beginning 17 July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017.

18 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an 19 unappropriated status.

(d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spentonly for the specified purpose.

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1 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any 2 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is 3 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to 4 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

(4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future 5 б Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only 7 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for 8 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of 9 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what 10 11 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2017-2019 12 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for 13 14 the project or program in the future.

2015 SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 101. FOR THE OFFICE OF FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT— 18 EMERGENCY DROUGHT RESPONSE

19 The appropriation in this section is subject to the following 20 conditions and limitations: The appropriation in this section is 21 provided solely for expenditure into the state drought preparedness 22 account established in RCW 43.83B.430.

23 General Fund—State Appropriation (FY 2015). \$14,000,000

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 102.** A new section is added to 2013 2nd sp.s. 25 c 19 (uncodified) to read as follows:

26 FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY

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27 2015 Drought Emergency (92000146)

The appropriations in this section are subject to the following conditions and limitations:

(1) The appropriations in this section are provided solely for response to a statewide drought declared pursuant to chapter 43.83B RCW. The department of ecology may provide funding or compensation for purchase or lease of water rights and to public bodies as defined in RCW 43.83B.050 in connection with projects and measures designed to alleviate drought conditions that may affect: Public health and safety; drinking water supplies; agricultural activities; or fish and wildlife survival. The state taxable building construction account—
state appropriation must be expended for projects and activities
related to those projects for which the anticipated benefits exceed
ten years.

(2) Projects or measures for which funding or compensation will 5 be provided must be connected with a water system, water source, or б 7 water body that is receiving, or has been projected to receive, less than seventy-five percent of normal water supply, as the result of 8 natural drought conditions. This reduction in water supply must be 9 such that it is causing, or will cause, undue hardship for the 10 entities or fish or wildlife depending on the water supply. General 11 12 criteria for guidelines to be established by the department of 13 ecology for distribution of funds must include: A balanced and equitable distribution of the funds among the different sectors 14 affected by drought; a funding process that ensures funds are 15 available for drought impacts that arise both early and later during 16 17 the course of the drought; and preference for projects that leverage other federal and local funds. 18

30 The reappropriations in this section are subject to the following 31 conditions and limitations:

(1) The reappropriations in this section are provided solely for response to a statewide drought declared pursuant to chapter 43.83B RCW. The department of ecology may provide funding or compensation for purchase or lease of water rights and to public bodies as defined in RCW 43.83B.050 in connection with projects and measures designed

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to alleviate drought conditions that may affect: Public health and safety; drinking water supplies; agricultural activities; or fish and wildlife survival. The state taxable building construction account state reappropriation must be expended for projects and activities related to those projects for which the anticipated benefits exceed ten years.

7 (2) Projects or measures for which funding or compensation will be provided must be connected with a water system, water source, or 8 water body that is receiving, or has been projected to receive, less 9 than seventy-five percent of normal water supply, as the result of 10 natural drought conditions. This reduction in water supply must be 11 12 such that it is causing, or will cause, undue hardship for the 13 entities or fish or wildlife depending on the water supply. General 14 criteria for quidelines to be established by the department of ecology for distribution of funds must include: A balanced and 15 equitable distribution of the funds among the different sectors 16 17 affected by drought; a funding process that ensures funds are available for drought impacts that arise both early and later during 18 the course of the drought; and preference for projects that leverage 19 other federal and local funds. 20

21 (3) Up to \$1,000,000 of the state drought preparedness account 22 reappropriation may be spent on early actions prior to a possible drought declaration in 2016 if the department of ecology determines 23 that data indicate the 2015 drought is likely to extend into a second 24 year. If a 2016 drought declaration is not made pursuant to chapter 25 43.83B RCW by August 1, 2016, unobligated amounts of the state 26 drought preparedness account—state reappropriation 27 must be 28 transferred to the disaster response account established in RCW 29 38.52.105.

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PART III

MISCELLANEOUS

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 301. This act is necessary for the immediate 2 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 3 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 4 effect immediately.

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
