SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 6544

- AN ACT Relating to simplifying behavioral health regulations and aligning them with other health regulations to support clinical integration; adding a new section to chapter 71.24 RCW; and creating new sections.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 71.24 7 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) The department and the Washington state health care authority 8 9 shall convene а task force including participation by 10 representative cross-section of behavioral health organizations and 11 behavioral health providers to align regulations between behavioral health and primary health care settings and simplify regulations for 12 13 behavioral health providers. The alignment must support clinical 14 integration from the standpoint of standardizing practices culture in a manner that to the extent practicable reduces barriers 15 16 to access, including reducing the paperwork burden for patients and 17 providers. Brief integrated behavioral health services must not, in 18 general, take longer to document than to provide. Regulations should 19 emphasize the desired outcome rather than how they should be 20 achieved. The task force may also make recommendations to the 21 department concerning subsections (2) and (3) of this section.

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(2) The department shall collaborate with the department of health, the Washington state health care authority, and other appropriate government partners to reduce unneeded costs and burdens to health plans and providers associated with excessive audits, the licensing process, and contracting. In pursuit of this goal, the department shall consider steps such as cooperating across divisions and agencies to combine audit functions when multiple audits of an agency or site are scheduled, sharing audit information across divisions and agencies to reduce redundancy of audits, and treating organizations with multiple sites and programs as single entities instead of as multiple agencies.

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- 12 department shall review its practices under RCW (3) The 71.24.035(5)(c)(i) to determine whether its practices comply with the 13 14 statutory mandate to deem accreditation by recognized behavioral health accrediting bodies as equivalent to meeting 15 16 requirements, comport with standard practices used by other state 17 divisions or agencies, and properly incentivize voluntary accreditation to the highest industry standards. 18
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The department of social and health services and the Washington state health care authority shall report their progress under section 1 of this act to the relevant committees of the legislature by December 15, 2016.
- 23 Sec. 3. The department of social and health NEW SECTION. services, the Washington state health care authority, and the 24 25 department of health shall each develop performance management 26 systems to guide their operations. These systems shall involve implementation of measurable, objective, outcome-based goals suitable 27 for external assessment under the Baldrige excellence framework. 28 29 These agencies must develop clear timelines for implementation within 30 sixty days of the effective date of this section, and then shall 31 undergo a Baldrige assessment within two years, and every two years thereafter. Each agency must annually report its progress under this 32 33 section to the governor and the appropriate committees of the 34 legislature by December 1st of each year, including the results of 35 any external assessments.

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
